

Proclamation

WHEREAS, American Heart Month was established by President Lyndon B. Johnson under Presidential Proclamation 3566 in December 1963, 10 days after Congress issued a joint resolution requesting the president to issue an annual proclamation; and

WHEREAS, heart disease is the leading cause of death for men, women, and people of most racial and ethnic groups in the United States. About 695,000 people in the United States died from heart disease in 2021 - that's 1 in every 5 deaths; and

WHEREAS, 83% of Americans believe that heart attacks can be prevented but aren't motivated to do anything while 72% of Americans don't consider themselves at risk for heart disease and 58% put no effort into improving their heart health; and

WHEREAS, American Heart Month is observed to raise awareness on the importance of a healthy heart and to encourage healthy habits that help reduce the risk of heart disease. The warning signs for heart disease have been known to appear when people are as young as 18 years old. Red flags such as high blood pressure should be taken seriously and healthy habits should be adopted like getting 30 minutes of exercise every day, and talking with your doctor to develop healthy eating habits that promote heart health; and


