WHEREAS, February has been designated as African American History Month and will be observed and celebrated in our community; and

WHEREAS, this observance increases our awareness and knowledge of African American History and honors the many leaders and their contributions to our nation; and

WHEREAS, this month-long celebration provides us with an opportunity to promote a spirit of unity and embrace the diversity that has strengthened our nation; and

WHEREAS, the diverse cultural heritage of the United States of America has created the society that exists today; and

WHEREAS, it is important to recognize the contributions that African Americans have made to American history in their struggles for freedom and equality in order to deepen our understanding of our Nation's history; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Carter G. Woodson, the son of formerly enslaved parents and the second Black person to receive a Ph.D. from Harvard University launched the first Negro History Week 100 years ago in 1926; and

WHEREAS, annually since 1976 the President of the United States of America has declared the month of February as African American History Month, and our nation celebrates the impact that African Americans have made.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Antonio V. Arserio, Mayor of the City of Margate, do hereby proclaim the month of February 2026, as
