6	CITY OF MARGATE, FLORIDA, AMENDING THE CITY'S
7	CODE OF ORDINANCES BY AMENDING CHAPTER 33,
8	"POLICE AND LAW ENFORCEMENT; OFFENSES AND
9	MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS," ARTICLE VI,
10	"TRAFFIC CONTROL," BY ENACTING A NEW SECTION
11	33-73, ENTITLED "SPEED DETECTION SYSTEMS IN
12	SCHOOL ZONES," TO PROVIDE FOR PURPOSE AND
13	INTENT, DEFINITIONS; PROVIDING FOR THE
14	AUTHORIZATION TO USE SCHOOL SPEED LIMIT
15	DETECTION SYSTEMS, A DETERMINATION OF SAFETY
16	NEED, AND THE IMPLEMENTATION OF SPEED LIMIT
17	DETECTION SYSTEMS IN SCHOOL ZONES; PROVIDING
18	FOR A LOCAL HEARING OFFICER TO HEAR APPEALS;
19 20	PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; PROVIDING FOR
20 21	SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION; AND
21 22	PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.
22	WHEREAS, during the 2023 Legislative Session, the Florida
24	Legislature passed, and Governor DeSantis signed Chapter 2023-
25	174, Laws of Florida, "Enforcement of School Zone Speed Limits,"
26	amending certain provisions of state law governing the use of
27	automated Speed Detection Systems ("SDS") in School Zones, which

automated Speed Detection Systems ("SDS") in School Zones, which law became effective July 1, 2023, and is codified as Sections 316.003, 316.008, and 316.0776, Florida Statutes; and

WHEREAS, a speed detection system is defined in Section 30 31 316.003, Florida Statutes, as a "portable or fixed automated system used to detect a motor vehicle's speed using radar or LiDAR 32 33 and to capture a photograph or video of the rear of a motor 34 vehicle that exceeds the speed limit in force at the time of the 35 violation;" and

1 WHEREAS, Chapter 2023-174, Laws of Florida authorizes cities 2 to enforce applicable speed limits in school zones during school 3 sessions "through the use of a speed detection system for the detection of speed and capturing of photographs or videos for 4 5 violations in excess of 10 miles per hour over the speed limit in 6 force at the time of the violation;" and

WHEREAS, Chapter 2023-174, Laws of Florida further authorizes cities to place or install, or contract with a vendor to place or install, "a speed detection system within a roadway maintained as a school zone as provided in Section 316.1895, Florida Statutes, to enforce unlawful speed violations;" and

12 WHEREAS, Chapter 2023-174, Laws of Florida provides that such 13 a speed detection system must be installed in accordance with 14 placement and installation specifications established by the Florida Department of Transportation; and 15

16 WHEREAS, Chapter 2023-174, Laws of Florida directs cities to post signage "indicating photographic or video enforcement of the school zone speed limits," which "shall clearly designate the time 19 period during which the school zone speed limits are enforced 20 using a speed detection system and must meet the placement and installation specifications established by the Florida Department 22 of Transportation; " and

23 WHEREAS, Chapter 2023-174, Laws of Florida further directs 24 cities that begin a school zone speed detection system program to 25 "make a public announcement and conduct a public awareness 26 campaign of the proposed use of speed detection systems at least 27 30 days before commencing enforcement under the speed detection 28 system program;" and

WHEREAS, a city that operates school zone speed detection systems must annually report the results of all systems within the city's jurisdiction by placing the required report on an agenda of a regular or special meeting of the city's governing body; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 2023-174, Laws of Florida provides that a city may authorize a traffic infraction enforcement officer under Section 316.640, Florida Statutes, to issue uniform traffic citations for violations of Sections 316.1895 and 316.183, Florida Statutes, as authorized by Section 316.008(9), Florida Statutes, and further regulates how such notices of violation shall be sent and what information such notices must include; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 2023-174, Laws of Florida further provides for penalties to be assessed and remitted to various entitles, as well as for a process whereby individuals who receive notices of violation may request a hearing; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 2023-174, Laws of Florida prescribes that a city electing to authorize traffic infraction enforcement officers to issue uniform traffic citations "must designate by resolution existing staff to serve as the clerk to the local hearing officer;" and

WHEREAS, Chapter 2023-174, Laws of Florida provides that a city implementing speed detection systems "must enact an ordinance in order to authorize the placement or installation of a speed detection system on a roadway maintained as a school zone" and that, as part of the public hearing on such proposed ordinance, the city must consider traffic data or other evidence supporting the installation and operation of each proposed school zone speed detection system, and "must determine that the school zone where

1 a speed detection system is to be placed or installed constitutes 2 a heightened safety risk that warrants additional enforcement 3 measures;" and

WHEREAS, speeding in designated school zones presents a threat to the health and safety of the public, and, in particular, all school-aged children in the City; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to implement a speed detection system program in school zones in order to reduce speeding and benefit the public safety; and

10 WHEREAS, consistent with the requirements of Section 11 316.008(c), Florida Statutes, in consideration of creating a speed 12 detection system program, the City held a public hearing at which 13 traffic data demonstrating a significant safety need for traffic 14 infraction detectors was presented; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with and pursuant to the provisions of Section316.088(c), Florida Statutes, the City has considered traffic data or other evidence supporting the installation and operation of each proposed school zone speed detection system, and had determined that each school zone where a speed detection system is to be placed or installed constitutes a heightened safety risk that warrants additional measures.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF MARGATE, FLORIDA:

Section 1: Ratification. That the foregoing "WHEREAS" clauses are hereby ratified and confirmed as being true and correct and are hereby made a specific part of this ordinance.

Section 2: That Chapter 33, "Police and Law Enforcement; Offenses and Miscellaneous Provisions," Article VI, "Traffic

12 13	(a) <u>Purpose and intent.</u>
14 15 16 17 18 19 20 21	(1) <u>The City elects to commence the use of Automated</u> <u>Speed Detection</u> <u>Systems ("SDS") in school zones</u> within its jurisdiction in accordance with the provisions of state law, including Chapter 316, Florida Statutes, and authorizes the placement of SDS within School Zones in the City in accordance with Chapter 316, Florida Statutes.
22 23 24 25 26 27 28 29 30 31 32	(2) The City shall utilize SDS consistent with and pursuant to all applicable provisions of state law in order to detect, process and penalize speeding in its school zones, as set forth in the Florida Uniform Traffic Control Law. The use of SDS shall be deemed a supplemental means of enforcing state law, and nothing herein shall be construed or operate to preclude the enforcement of the Florida Uniform Traffic Control Law by any other means provided by law.
33 34	(b) <u>Definitions.</u>
35 36 37	For purposes of this ordinance, the following terms shall have the meanings given to them below.
38 39	(1) <i>Motor vehicle</i> shall mean, as defined by Section 316.003, Florida Statutes, a self-propelled vehicle

not operated upon rails or guideway, but not including any bicycle, electric bicycle, motorized scooter, electric personal assistive mobility device, mobile carrier, personal delivery device, swamp buggy, or moped.

(2) <u>School zone shall mean that portion of a street or</u> <u>highway established as a school zone pursuant to</u> <u>Section 316.1895, Florida Statutes, as it may be</u> amended.

(3) <u>Speed detection system shall mean a portable or fixed</u> <u>automated system used to detect a motor vehicle's</u> <u>speed using radar or LiDAR and to capture a photograph</u> <u>or video of the rear of a motor vehicle that exceeds</u> <u>the speed limit in force at the time of the violation.</u> <u>This term is synonymous with the term "Speed Detection</u> <u>System" defined in Section 316.003(83), Florida</u> <u>Statutes, as it may be amended.</u>

(c) Authorizing Use of School Zone Speed Limit Detection Systems.

Pursuant to Section 316.008(9), Florida Statutes, the City of Margate hereby elects to use speed detection systems to enforce speed limits within school the City's zone jurisdiction. The City may utilize a speed limit detection system as a supplemental means of monitoring the speed of vehicles and assisting law enforcement personnel in the enforcement of compliance with laws related to speed limits within school zones as permitted and provided for by general law, which are designed to protect and improve the public health, safety, and welfare of the community and thereby reduce accidents, injuries, and disruption of traffic associated with such violations.

(d) Determination of Safety Need.

19 20 21 22 23 24 25 26 27 28 29 30 31	(1) In accordance with the provisions of Chapter 2023-174, Laws of Florida, as of the effective date of this ordinance, the City authorizes the implementation of the provisions and requirements of Sections 316.008 and 316.1896, Florida Statutes. The City will implement speed detection systems within the City of Margate consistent with the placement and installation specifications established by the Florida Department of Transportation, as such may be amended from time to time, to enforce unlawful speed violations, as specified in Sections 316.1895 and 316.183, Florida Statutes, on roadways maintained as school zones.
32 33 34 35 36 37	(2) <u>Designation of Local Hearing Officer</u> . The City's <u>Special Magistrate</u> , as a <u>Local Hearing Officer</u> , is <u>designated to conduct hearings requested by alleged</u> <u>violators desiring to contest notices of violation</u> <u>detected by SDS in accordance with Chapter 316</u> , Florida <u>Statutes</u> .

(3) Pursuant to Section 316.1896, Florida Statutes, a traffic infraction enforcement officer under Section 316.640, Florida Statutes, is authorized to issue uniform traffic citations for violations of Sections 316.1895 and 316.183, Florida Statutes, as authorized by Section 316.008(9), Florida Statutes.

- (4) Notices, Penalties and Appeals. The City's Police Chief, or designee, shall provide notices of violation, assess penalties, remit applicable portions of assessed penalties, and provide for hearing procedures and appeals consistent with the requirements of Chapter 2023-174, Laws of Florida, as such may be amended from time to time.
- (5) <u>Signage and Public Awareness Campaign</u>. The City's Police Chief, or designee, shall post signage and conduct a public awareness campaign regarding the placement or installation of speed detection systems consistent with the requirements of Chapter 2023-174, Laws of Florida, as such may be amended from time to time.
- (6) <u>Reporting.</u> The City's Police Chief, or designee, shall comply with the reporting requirements of Chapter 2023-174, Laws of Florida, as such may be amended from time to time.

<u>Section 3:</u> <u>Conflicts.</u> That all ordinances or parts of ordinances, all City Code sections or parts of City Code sections, and all resolutions or parts of resolutions in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

<u>Section 4:</u> <u>Severability</u>. That should any section or provision of this ordinance or any portion thereof, any paragraph, sentence, clause or word be declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remainder hereof as a whole or part hereof other than the part declared invalid.
