**DISTRICT FOUR
HIGHWAY MAINTENANCE MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT**

THIS AGREEMENT, entered into this _____ day of _____, 20__, by and between the **STATE OF FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION**, a component agency of the State of Florida, hereinafter called the DEPARTMENT and The City of Margate a political subdivision of the State of Florida, or a municipal corporation existing under the Laws of Florida, hereinafter called the AGENCY collectively referred to as Parties.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the AGENCY has jurisdiction over SW 11th Street from SR 7 to SW 49th Avenue as part of the City of Margate roadway system; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Sections 339.07, 339.08 and 339.12, Florida Statutes and Federal funding provisions the DEPARTMENT is authorized to undertake projects within the AGENCY's geographical limits and the AGENCY agrees to have this improvement constructed; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Title 23, U.S. Code, Section 116 and Federal Highway Administration regulations issued pursuant thereto, there must be an agreement with the AGENCY to maintain the project; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to such authority, the DEPARTMENT and the AGENCY agrees to have the DEPARTMENT construct certain improvements more particularly described as Financial Project ID 429576-6-52-01, which involves Extension of left turn lane on east leg of SR 7 and SW 11th Street; Construct 5 ft sidewalk on south side of SW 11th Street from east of SW 55th Ave to west of SW 50th Ave, Construct speed humps, hereinafter referred to as the "Project", as more particularly described in **Exhibit A**; and

WHEREAS, the DEPARTMENT may not spend state funds for off-system projects; and

WHEREAS, upon acquisition of the necessary right-of-way, if needed, the DEPARTMENT will proceed to construct the Project; and

WHEREAS, the Parties hereto mutually recognize the need for entering into an Agreement designating and setting forth the responsibilities of each party; and

WHEREAS, the AGENCY by Resolution on the 3rd day of March, 2021, a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit B and by this reference made a part hereof, desires to enter into this Agreement and authorizes its officers to do so.

NOW THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the mutual benefits to flow each to the other, the Parties covenant and agree as follows:

1. The recitals set forth above are true and correct and are deemed incorporated herein.
2. The DEPARTMENT has undertaken and obtained the approval of Federal participation for the Project. The AGENCY is responsible for additional Project costs determined to be Federal Aid Non-Participating.
3. The AGENCY shall allow the DEPARTMENT and its contractors to enter onto the existing AGENCY's property. The DEPARTMENT will submit the design plans, including the tree disposition plans, thru the AGENCY's permitting process in Project Dox. If required, the AGENCY shall satisfy any tree permit obligation imposed by Broward County. The AGENCY will issue a permit to the Contractor once the Notice to Proceed has been issued by the DEPARTMENT for construction of the Project. No additional permits or permit fees will be charged to the DEPARTMENT or its Contractor by the AGENCY.
4. The AGENCY shall continue to maintain the existing roadway and any property owned by AGENCY until the DEPARTMENT begins construction of the Project. The AGENCY shall continue to be responsible for mowing and litter removal during the duration of the Project.
5. Upon "final acceptance" by the DEPARTMENT of the Project, (as "final acceptance" is described in the Standard Specifications for Roadway and Bridge Construction dated 2023, as amended), and Notice thereof to the AGENCY, the AGENCY shall maintain the Project, at its own cost, in accordance with the following Federally and State accepted standards: (a) FDOT Design Manual (FDM), current edition (b) Florida Green Book dated 2016, as amended (c) Governing standards and specifications: FDOT Design Standards dated FY 2023-2024, as amended (d) Standard Specifications for Roadway and Bridge Construction dated 2023, as amended by contract documents, and (e) Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD), current edition, or as amended. Maintenance of said Project includes maintaining pavement, curb and gutter, sidewalks, regraded swales, drainage inlets, signing, and pavement markings.
 - a. The AGENCY grants to the DEPARTMENT all rights necessary to enter and construct the Project.
 - b. The Department shall give the AGENCY fourteen (14) days' notice before final inspection. The AGENCY will have the opportunity to inspect and identify corrections to the PROJECT within fourteen (14) days' notice and the DEPARTMENT agrees to undertake those corrections prior to final acceptance so long as the corrections comply with the Final Proposed Construction plans and specification previously approved by both the DEPARTMENT and the AGENCY.
6. No additional right of way is required for the PROJECT. The PROJECT can be completed within the AGENCY's existing right of way.
7. Warranties: The DEPARTMENT shall transfer any applicable warranties to the AGENCY.

8. Environmental permitting: If requested by the DEPARTMENT, the AGENCY shall sign as a joint applicant and be responsible for the permits related to the Project. Further the AGENCY shall be solely responsible for ensuring that the Project remains in compliance with all permits after the construction is complete and the right of way is transferred to the AGENCY. To the extent permitted by law, the AGENCY shall indemnify the DEPARTMENT for any violations by the AGENCY of any permits issued to the Department or jointly to the AGENCY and the DEPARTMENT after construction is complete. The AGENCY shall execute all documentation required by the permitting agencies in a timely manner to accept transfer of the Project. The AGENCY shall be the applicant for all occupancy permits that are required for the Project.
9. Utilities: The AGENCY shall cooperate with the DEPARTMENT, to the extent necessary, to accomplish utility relocations for this Project. This shall include, but not be limited to, entering into utility subordination agreements with the affected utility owners, thereby assuming liability for future utility relocations within the AGENCY right of way and proposed right of way. At its own expense, the AGENCY shall comply with any and all request of the DEPARTMENT to provide written notice to utility owner to initiate work necessary to alleviate interference; to remove or relocate non-compliant utilities; and to place liens upon non-compliant utility owners within the AGENCY right of way, as defined in Florida Statutes 337.403 and 337.404. The AGENCY shall be liable and reimburse the DEPARTMENT for any cost incurred by the DEPARTMENT for the AGENCY's failure to timely comply with said request.
 - a. AGENCY'S Utilities: The AGENCY shall relocate and adjust its own utilities including connection with utility customers.
10. Signals: The AGENCY shall cooperate with the DEPARTMENT to effect signal and interconnect connections for the Project.
11. Drainage: The AGENCY shall cooperate with the DEPARTMENT to integrate any proposed drainage, including drainage inlets, French drains and regraded swales into the AGENCY'S existing drainage system.
12. Unforeseen issues: If unforeseen issues shall arise, the AGENCY shall cooperate with the DEPARTMENT to the extent necessary to construct the Project. This shall include but not be limited to the execution of documents; allowing the Department and/or their contractors/consultants to enter upon the real property owned, leased, possessed and/or controlled by the Agency upon which the Project is to be constructed or any property adjacent thereto.
13. This document incorporates and includes all prior negotiations, correspondence, conversations, agreements, or understandings as represented in the Final Proposed Construction plans. Accordingly, it is agreed that no deviation from the terms hereof shall be predicated upon any prior representation or agreements whether oral or written.

14. The DEPARTMENT will provide the AGENCY with as-builts as a part of the final acceptance package.

15. Additional Insured: The DEPARTMENT shall include the following paragraph as part of Section 7-13.2 of the Standard Specifications for Road and Bridge Construction, Division 1, General Requirements and Covenants (January 2023), as amended, applicable to this Project:

“Cause the City of Margate to be an additional insured party on the Contractor’s Public Liability and Property Damages Liability Insurance policies that ensure the Contractor for the described work that it performs under the Contract.”

16. This Agreement shall be governed, interpreted, and construed according to the laws of the State of Florida.

PROJECT SCOPE

All of the improvements are to be completed by DEPARTMENT within the AGENCY's existing right-of-way.

- Extension of left turn lane on east leg of SR 7 and SW 11th Street (as recommended from lane repurposing study
- Construct 5 ft sidewalk on south side of SW 11th Street from east of SW 55th Ave to west of SW 50th Ave
- Construct speed humps as recommended by City of Margate speed study and public application request for traffic calming.
- One tree will need to be relocated on site.
