5 AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MARGATE,  
6 FLORIDA, PROVIDING FOR AUTHORIZATION OF  
7 PURCHASES, BID AWARDS, AND CONTRACTS BY THE  
8 CITY MANAGER; PROVIDING FOR APPROVAL OF  
9 CONTRACTS BY THE CITY COMMISSION; PROVIDING  
10 FOR NONAPPLICABILITY TO COOPERATIVE  
11 BIDDING; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY;  
12 PROVIDING FOR RETROACTIVE APPLICATION;  
13 PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

16 WHEREAS, Section 4.10 Contracts and 4.11 Purchases and  
17 bid awards, of the Charter of the City of Margate was amended  
18 by referendum, approved by the voters of the City of Margate,  
19 in the general election of November 2014; and  
20

21 WHEREAS, the City Commission of the City of Margate  
22 desires to provide for purchases and bid awards that may be  
23 approved by the City Manager and contracts that require  
24 Commission approval.  
25

26 NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF  
27 THE CITY OF MARGATE, FLORIDA:

28 SECTION 1: The City Manager may authorize purchases and, bid  
29 awards, contracts, and contracts for bid awards for projects,  
30 supplies, materials or equipment on behalf of the City when  
31 individual expenditures do not exceed \$50,000.  
32

33 SECTION 2: All contracts for projects, supplies, materials or  
34 equipment that exceed \$50,000 must be approved by the City  
35 Commission.  
36

37 SECTION 3: The \$50,000 limitation and authorization/approval  
38 requirements in Sections 1 and 2 shall not apply to purchases  
39 made in accordance with City Code Section 2-25(b)-  
40 Nonapplicability to cooperative bidding with other  
41 governmental agencies.  
42

1 SECTION ~~34~~: For individual expenditures for projects,  
2 supplies, materials or equipment above \$25,000 and not  
3 exceeding \$50,000, notification of said expenditures shall be  
4 made to the City Commission.

5  
6 SECTION 5: This ordinance shall apply retroactively to  
7 December 17, 2014.

8  
9 SECTION 6: All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict  
10 herewith are and the same is hereby repealed to the extent of  
11 such conflict.

12  
13 SECTION 7: If any section, sentence, clause, or phrase of  
14 this ordinance is held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a  
15 court of competent jurisdiction, then said holding shall in no  
16 way affect the validity of the remaining portions of this  
17 ordinance.

18  
19 SECTION 8: This ordinance shall become effective immediately  
20 upon adoption at its second reading.
