SR-7 Multimodal Improvements Corridor Study




- Study was completed and adopted by MPO Board in July 2016.
- The study area is a mile wide corridor centered on SR-7 that runs from just south of the Miami-Dade County Line to north of Sample Road.
- The following goals were identified:
 - Improve safety for all users
 - Continue to improve transit service within the SR 7 corridor.
 - Invest in transportation solutions that are cost effective
 - Encourage land use and urban form to support multimodal transportation options
 - Reduce automobile traffic congestion without adversely impacting the mobility and/or
 - safety of cyclists, pedestrians, and transit users
- 8 groups of projects have moved to implementation



Project Background

- Broward MPO has established State Road 7 a High Priority transit corridor.
- Kimberly Blvd, SW 11th Street and Dr. Martin Luther King Blvd. were identified as corridors that could be improved to provide additional connectivity for non-vehicle users (pedestrians and cyclist) as part of Group 6.
- Partnership between Cities, FDOT, and BMPO to provide additional mobility options.



Proposed Improvements:


- Construction of the missing sidewalks from east of SW 55th Avenue to the west of 50th Ave.
- Upgrade the existing sidewalks and ramps as needed to meet ADA requirements.
- Roadway widening at the intersection of SR-7/US-441 to extend the left turn lane storage area
- Traffic calming speed humps will be added.






SW 11TH Street Proposed Typical Section 1

City of Margate (From SR 7 / US 441 to West of SW 55th Ave)



Proposed Improvements:


- Roadway widening to install bicycle lanes.

- Installation of pedestrian lighting under the I-95 bridge.


Maintenance of Traffic

- Access to businesses and private properties will be maintained at all times during construction






Maintenance of Traffic

- Estimated Construction Cost: \$4.5 Million


