These abductions have a devastating impact, causing deep emotional and psychological trauma not only to the abducted child but also to the left-behind parent and extended family. Such events often disrupt family stability and trust, with far-reaching effects on the broader community; and

WHEREAS, May serves as a pivotal time to combat family abductions, reunite missing children with their families, and recognize those dedicated to protecting society's most vulnerable. This month offers an opportunity to raise awareness, support affected families, and strengthen community efforts to prevent future abductions; and

WHEREAS, a family abduction occurs when a child is taken, wrongfully retained, or concealed by a parent or other family member, denying another individual their right to custody or visitation, even in cases with unclear or absent court orders. Such abductions are often driven by the perpetrator's frustration with the left-behind parent, the legal system, or personal circumstances; and

WHEREAS, the City of Margate is committed to remaining vigilant and informed about the dangers facing children in our community, recognizing that family abduction is a serious crime in all states, not merely a civil matter; and

WHEREAS, courts have determined that law enforcement must ensure children are with their lawful custodians and verify the validity of any court orders, as failure to establish necessary training and policies poses a threat to public safety.
