WHEREAS, the Florida Fish and Wildlife Commission (FWC) encourages removal of green iguanas from private properties by landowners; and

WHEREAS, captured iguanas cannot be relocated and released at other locations in Florida; and

WHEREAS, the Margate City Commission wishes to protect Margate property and wildlife from nuisance green iguanas while simultaneously protecting Margate persons and property.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF MARGATE, FLORIDA:

Section 1: That Chapter 6, "ANIMALS AND FOWL," Section 6-1, "City designated bird sanctuary," of the City of Margate Code of Ordinances be, and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 6-1. City designated bird and wildlife sanctuary.

(a) All of the territory embraced within the eCity limits of the City of Margate shall be and is hereby declared to be a bird and wildlife sanctuary. It is hereby declared that all territory embraced within the corporate limits of the cCity shall be and is hereby declared to be a bird and wildlife sanctuary. It shall

Cruelty and Injury to animals. 3 (a) It shall be unlawful for any person to torture, 4 torment, beat, kick, strike, mutilate, injure, disable 5 or kill any animal, except as provided herein. 6 (b) It shall be unlawful for any person to use painful techniques and devices, that may cause or are likely to 7 cause, physical injury, torment or pain and suffering 8 9 to animals, including, but not limited to: electric 10 prods or shocking devices; shocking spurs or rowels; 11 flank or bucking straps or similar devices; wire tie-12 downs; chains used as tie-downs; whips or bull-whips (excluding riding crops); ankuses or bull-hooks, or 13 14 similar devices. Exception: Non-native invasive iguana species 15 (C) 16 (a) Non-native invasive iguana species may be captured 17 and humanely euthanized, with permission of the 18 property owner, in accordance with the Florida Fish and 19 Wildlife Conservation Commission's and American 20 Veterinary Medical Association's guidelines.

SECTION 5: All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict are repealed to the extent of such conflict.

<u>SECTION 6</u>: If any section, sentence, clause, or phrase of this Ordinance is held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, then said holding shall in no way affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

SECTION 7: It is the intention of the City Commission that the provisions of this Ordinance shall become and be made a part of the City of Margate Code, and that the sections of this Ordinance may be renumbered or relettered and the word "ordinance" may be changed to "section", "article" or such other appropriate word or phrase in order to accomplish such intentions.
