

Proclamation

WHEREAS, throughout America's history, citizens have united during times of challenge to join together in prayer. Prayers have been lifted to express gratitude, request guidance and direction, and make petitions known; and

WHEREAS, a modern law formalizing the annual observance of a National Day of Prayer was enacted by Congress in 1952, and was amended in 1988, to designate the first Thursday of May as the National Day of Prayer, and Americans are called to a day of prayer on the first Thursday of May annually; and

WHEREAS, Thursday May 1, 2014, is designated as the 63rd annual United States National Day of Prayer and its theme is "One Voice United in Prayer" ; and

WHEREAS, residents shall gather together in Margate and throughout the United States to unite in prayer, for our nation, our leaders, and our people, and they shall recognize and honor the service and sacrifice of the men and women of the United States Armed Forces for their commitment to uphold the nation's ideals, and recognize that it is because of them that Americans can continue to live in a nation where people of all faiths can worship or not worship according to the dictates of their conscience; and


