18 19 20 21 22	SECTION 1: The Code of the City of Margate, Florida, Appendix A Zoning, Article XVIII RVRP District, Section 18.5 Design Standards, is hereby amended to read as follows:
23 24 25 26 27 28 29 30 31 32	(9) Decorative features: Each site may include decorative features such as gazebos, tiki huts, decorative railings, walls, benches, patios, steps, decks, trellises, arbors, water fountains, ponds, <u>swimming pools, spas, hot tubs,</u> waterfalls, bridges, planters and flower beds, fire pits, fireplaces, barbecues, outdoor kitchens and bars, outdoor lighting, outdoor living and entertainment areas, heaters, furniture, and additional landscaping improvements.
33 34	(a) All features must comply with individual lot setbacks as provided for in this article.
35 36 37 38 39 40 41 42	(b) No decorative feature shall be installed on any lot without first obtaining a permit from the Margate Building Department. <u>All permit applications for</u> <u>decorative features submitted to the Margate Building</u> <u>Department must include written approval from the RVRP</u> <u>condominium association.</u>

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All applications for decorative features proposed to (C) be located off of the approved pad on a site must demonstrate compliance with the approved drainage permit for the RV Resort Park. Any gazebo or other similar hard-roofed decorative (d) feature installed on an RV lot shall be subject to the following limitations: Shall not be enclosed, except for a single (i) bathroom. Said bathroom shall not exceed one hundred forty (140) square feet in area or thirty (30) per cent of the gross area of the gazebo/decorative feature, whichever measurement is less. (ii) May have knee walls not exceeding forty-two (42) inches in height under all portions of gazebo/decorative feature not used for the bathroom. Portions of a gazebo used as a carport shall not have knee walls. (iii) Openings shall not be permanently sealed or glazed, but may be secured with hurricane shutters. Portions of a gazebo used as a carport shall not have shutters installed. (iv) May feature a single hinged doorway entrance into the gazebo/decorative feature no greater than six (6) feet in width, if hurricane shutters are installed to the structure. Shall not exceed twenty-five (25) feet in height. (V) (vi) These provisions shall not apply to chickee huts, as defined in the Florida Building Code, or other thatched roof structure. (vii) Gazebos may be designed to include an attached carport, provided that the carport portion of the gazebo does not feature knee walls or shutters. Enclosed garages shall not be permitted. Swimming pools, spas, and hot tubs shall be permitted (e) on all RV sites, including portions located under a 2 CODING: Words in struck through type are deletions from existing text; Words in underscored type are

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1 permitted gazebo or tiki hut, subject to the following 2 conditions: 3 4 (i) An executed maintenance agreement between the RV 5 site owner(s) and the RV park condominium 6 association shall be submitted with all building 7 permit applications for swimming pools, spas, and/or hot tubs, providing that at a minimum, the 8 9 RV park condominium association will be responsible for maintaining the swimming pool, 10 11 spa, and/or hot tub during the RV site owner's 12 absence. 13 14 (ii) No swimming pool, spa, or hot tub shall be placed 15 within any recorded easement. 16 (iii) All pool barrier requirements provided by the 17 18 Florida Building Code shall be satisfied at the same time that any swimming pool, spa, or hot tub 19 20 is permitted by the Margate Building Department. 21 All safety barriers installed on an RV site shall 22 take the form of either a decorative white 23 aluminum fence or a decorative masonry wall, or any combination thereof. The maximum height of 24 25 any fence or wall installed as a safety barrier on an RV site shall be fifty-four (54) inches. 26 27 Any safety barrier, or portion thereof, that is 28 located parallel to any RV lot structure, gazebo, tiki hut, or other similar structure on a given 29 30 lot shall be spaced at least three (3) feet from said decorative feature(s). All fences and walls 31 32 shall be installed so that the structural side of the fence or wall shall face or be visible from 33 34 the owner's side. No fence or wall shall be 35 erected that would inhibit vehicular access or 36 parking on an RV pad. 37 38 (iv) Swimming pools, spas, or hot tubs in ground exceeding eight thousand (8,000) gallons shall 39 40 have a dry well and/or storm drain to be drained into if not located adjacent to a canal. 41 42 43 44 45 3 CODING: Words in struck through type are deletions
