WHEREAS, libraries continue to grow and evolve in order to provide for the needs of every member of their communities; and

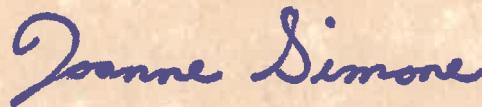
WHEREAS, libraries, librarians, library staff, the Friends of the Margate Library, and supporters across America are celebrating National Library Week.
