BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF MARGATE, FLORIDA:

SECTION 1: That the City Commission of the City of Margate awards RFP No. 2010-001 approving contract with J & J Towing, Inc. to provide towing services for the City of Margate for an initial period of five (5) years with an option to renew for an additional five (5) year period. In addition City shall receive a service fee of \$52,000 annually payable in twelve (12) monthly installments of \$4, 333.33.

 $\underline{\text{SECTION 2:}}$  That the Mayor and City Manager are hereby authorized and directed to execute a contract for the award of RFP Towing Services to J & J Towing, Inc.

SECTION 3: That this Resolution shall become effective immediately upon its passage.

J & J and the CITY OF MARGATE, a municipal corporation	
State of Florida, hereinafter referred to as CITY.	

### WITNESSETH

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants herein contained, together with other good and valuable considerations, the parties hereto agree as follows:

- 1. The Contract Documents consist of all of the following: Request for Proposal (RFP) document 2010-001 To Provide Towing Services to the City of Margate, any and all addenda to the RFP document, J & J's response to the RFP dated August 3, 2010 and all associated forms including the rate schedule (Attachment A), certificate of insurance, etc. which are made a part of this contract, or any additional documents which are required to be submitted under the contract, and all amendments, modifications and supplements issued on or after the effective date of the contract.
- 2. J & J shall in accordance with instructions received from the CITY, provide at the CITY's direction, towing and wrecker service within the city limits of the CITY of Margate effective October 1, 2010 for a period of five (5) years with an option to renew for an additional five (5) year period under such terms and in accordance with such specifications as may from time to time be specified by the CITY.
- 3. J & J shall not engage directly or indirectly or through any subsidiary or other entity in the automobile repair or automobile paint and body repair business.
- 4. The CITY shall request the services of J & J whenever towing or wrecker services is required in a situation where the owner of the motor vehicle involved does not specify or instruct the CITY to telephone or order service from a specific towing or wrecker services; or where the use of J & J is deemed to be in the best interest of the CITY. However, in the event that J & J, in the opinion of and within the discretion of the CITY, does not have available the necessary equipment to provide the service required at a particular time or place, the CITY may at its discretion call upon another towing or wrecker services to provide a part of or all of the equipment required in any particular circumstance. Further, in the event that J & J does not provide service within a reasonable time following the request of the CITY, then and in that event the CITY may in its discretion call upon another towing or wrecker service to provide the service required.

- 5. In the event that J & J cannot by reason of equipment failure or other reason, respond adequately to the CITY's needs, it shall be the responsibility of J & J to advise the CITY immediately and to further advise the CITY of the length of terms of J & J's inability to provide adequate service so that the CITY may call upon other towing or wrecker services during this period.
- 6. J & J's charges and fees for towing and wrecker services rendered within the city limits of the City of Margate in connection with the provisions of this agreement shall be set by the City Commission and shall at all times be posted with the CITY as well as in public view within all of J & J's offices.
- 7. J & J agrees to maintain, at all times, modern up-to-date equipment capable of meeting all of the needs of the CITY in connection with the terms of this agreement, and further, J & J agrees that said equipment shall in addition to the specifications and requirements as set forth in the attached Attachment "A" also be manned by well-trained courteous personnel.
- 8. J & J shall pay to the CITY the sum of fifty-two thousand dollars (\$52,000.00) annually, payable in twelve equal monthly installments of four thousand three hundred thirty-three dollars and 33 cents (\$4333.33). The CITY shall invoice J & J on the first of each month for the previous month's service period. Payments must be paid no later than the 15<sup>th</sup> of every month for the duration of this agreement.
- 9. J & J further agrees upon demand of the CITY to make its books and records available for inspection by the CITY and to provide for the interrogation of J & J's principals and employees by the CITY in the event that any such interrogation or investigation may become necessary in connection with any other matter of interest to the CITY involving the towing and wrecker service. J & J shall maintain adequate and accurate records of all calls, and the disposition of all vehicles and all billings and revenue. A minimum 5 years of records must be maintained at all times.
- 10. J & J agrees to submit its trucks and equipment to inspection by the CITY at any reasonable time set forth in the CITY's request so as to insure compliance with all of the terms of this agreement and the terms of the attached specifications in Attachment "A".
- 11. It is expressly understood by and between the parties to this agreement that the CITY is a municipal corporation and that this agreement relates to the provision to the CITY of service that clearly affects the health and welfare of the citizens of the City of Margate. Notwithstanding all of the above, it is further understood that J & J Towing is an independent contractor governed by the terms of this contract and not an employee or general agent of the City of Margate. The provision of towing and wrecker service is further clearly related to the maintenance of the CITY's vehicles and the safety of the streets and thoroughfares of the CITY. By virtue of the extraordinary nature of the CITY's obligation and by virtue of the unusual nature of the obligations of the CITY dealt with in this agreement, it is understood and acknowledged by J & J that this agreement shall be

terminated by the CITY immediately at any time that it becomes apparent to the CITY that J & J is not performing in accordance with the terms and requirements of this agreement or that J & J does not have the facilities and capabilities of performing in accordance with the terms of this agreement. For the purpose of this agreement and this section of the agreement, these terms include not only the terms set forth in this agreement, but also the terms of the Attachment "A" (a copy of which is attached), and such additional or other terms and requirements as may from time to time during the course of this agreement be imposed by the CITY in order to insure the adequate provision of towing and wrecker service to the CITY. It is further understood and agreed that J & J does hereby release the CITY from any such claim for any damages of any kind in accordance with their performance under the terms of this agreement in the event of the cancellation of this agreement by the CITY at any time. Further, it is understood that by the very nature of the terms of this agreement and the municipal function related to herein that the CITY may cancel this agreement at any time.


- 12. J & J agrees to release and hold harmless and to defend and pay on behalf of the CITY from any and all claims, suits for damages of whatsoever kind brought against the CITY or in which the CITY is named as a defendant arriving out of this agreement, servants or employees or assigns, during the terms of this agreement. Further J & J agrees to hold harmless and to pay all costs, judgements and reasonable attorneys' fees incurred by the CITY as a result of any act of J & J, its agents, servants or employees in connection with its performance under the terms of this agreement.
- 13. J & J agrees to perform emergency door unlock services at no charge when called upon by the CITY to unlock a vehicle that is occupied by a small child or an animal.
- 14. J & J agrees to be utilized at no charge to the CITY as part of the CITY's onsite disaster response team. As such, J & J shall stage as requested by the CITY one (1) tow vehicle (minimum class A) with operator at the CITY's Emergency Operations Center (E.O.C.) or other facility as designated by the CITY. A tow vehicle and operator shall be staged onsite at the beginning of a CITY declared emergency and remain available to render services as needed for clearing roadways of vehicles and debris as required for the duration of the declared emergency.
- 15. J & J shall upon request by CITY's police department remove component parts (hoods, doors, windows, etc.) of any towed vehicle in storage at no charge to the CITY.
- 16. The RFP specifications shall be amended and/or changed and the amendments and changes shall be incorporated into this contract as follow:
  - a. Section 3 d.: J & J must have a minimum of two (2) vehicles available to respond within twenty (20) minutes to an emergency scene, and a response time of no more than forty (40) minutes for non-emergency

calls, on a twenty-four (24) hour basis to assist the City's Police or Fire Department. If said response times exceed the times specified, the delay may be punishable by a \$50.00 fine charged to the Contractor or the Contractor's performance bond.

- b. J & J shall allow the owner of a towed vehicle to remove the auto tag and any unattached personal possessions in accordance with F.S. 320.0609.
- c. Storage of vehicles shall be in accordance with F.S. 713.78.
- d. J & J shall provide a monthly report to the CITY's police department listing all "police hold" vehicles in their possession for storage.
- e. CITY agrees to provide lien checks for towed vehicles at no charge to the contractor upon request.
- The contract may be terminated by the CITY without cause upon providing J & J with a least thirty (30) days prior written notice.

Should either party fail to perform any of its obligations under this contract for a period of thirty (30) days after receipt of written notice of such failure, the non-defaulting party will have the right to terminate the contract immediately upon delivery of written notice to the defaulting party of its election to do so. The foregoing rights of termination are in addition to any other rights and remedies that such party may have.

### **SCOPE OF SERVICES PROPOSED**

J & J Towing Inc. is located and operating primarily in the City of Margate since 1984. J & J Towing has been in business for 26 years, within the growth of 26 years in business the company has done a diversified number of police rotation calls and assistant to multiple motor clubs such as AAA, ALLSTATE

MOTORCLUB, GEICO, USAC, CROSS COUNTRY MOTORCLUB, ROAD

AMERICA, SIGNATURE GROUP, with the understanding that motor clubs provide assistance to stranded motorist.

J & J Towing is fully aware of the qualifications and equipment needed in order to be considered for this bid, we have all the equipment needed, expertise in knowledge and are an excellent company that would provide the most effective service for the City of Margate.

J & J Towing is a family owned and operated company that was started with a plan for growth at a rate that would allow us to keep a high level of customer satisfaction. We never wanted to expand so fast that our customers were kept waiting or not given proper service. A current work load assessment revealed that the fleet of tow trucks are available a majority of the day. This does not include the Class D type of heavy equipment that is constantly available at a moments notice. This is one of the reason that Joseph or Michael Cammarata remain as much as possible around the shop. This allows them a quick response time for emergency calls with any one of our trucks. From the small Class A

to the large Class D, and even the tractor-Landoll combination, they can respond within minutes to all areas of the city. Arrangements have been made that all types of equipment can be brought out to the scene and Joseph or Michael Cammarata can meet the equipment at the scene taking over the towing command at the scene. Our trucks have voluntarily participated in numerous parades and festivals at the request of organizations or individuals. Our past and current status of a 20 to 40 minute arrival time for road clearance time has always been met within the contracted estimated time of arrival.

We also encourage training and information sharing with specialized police

Homicide to see what they expect of us or how they would want us to work with
them (when needed) both at the scene and at the impound yard.

Our tools, equipment, and knowledge of vehicles would always be available when needed. We would also provide Office equipped with phones, fax machine, or what ever else we might be able to provide. This also would be extended to any investigators or officers at the scene or at our facility. We would assist in all types of training such as Underwater Recovery, crime scene protection, and whatever would be necessitated by the city of Margate. We also will donate vehicles to law enforcement or the fire department for whatever type of training they required. J & J Towing understands the importance of new and updated safety rules and equipment. We attend all seminars and demonstrations to further our professional knowledge.

Our equipment ranges from wreckers, car carriers, medium duty, heavy duty, to ultra-heavy duty rotators, equipment transport, traffic support, and spill response.

# CITY OF MARGATE, FLORIDA REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS

#### 2010-001

The City of Margate ("City") invites qualified firms to submit proposals to provide vehicle towing and wrecker services within the city limits of the City of Margate for an initial term of five years, with the option of one renewal term for an additional five years.

The City will receive sealed proposals until 3:00 P.M., Tuesday, August 3, 2010, in the City's Purchasing Division Office, 5790 Margate Boulevard, Margate, Florida, 33063. E-mailed or faxed proposals will not be accepted. A **MANDATORY** pre-proposal conference will be held at 10:00 A.M., Tuesday, July 20, 2010, in the City Hall Commission Chambers at the above address. Only firms who have had a representative in attendance and signed in at the pre-proposal conference will be eligible to submit a proposal.

### 1. Scope Of Services

The City of Margate, Florida desires to enter into a contract with a qualified firm to provide vehicle towing and wrecker service within the corporate limits of the City of Margate. The Contractor shall have exclusive rights to provide service for private vehicles ordered towed by City authorities, within the City of Margate, except as otherwise noted herein. The towing service, at a minimum shall also include no charge towing for all City vehicles, including any vehicle that is confiscated by the City's police department that requires towing from within Broward County. When requested, the towing service will have the exclusive right to tow from any City property to include any CRA property. The vendor agrees to provide to the City at no charge appropriate "Tow Away" signs.

Based on historical information, the successful Contractor will perform approximately 3000 tows per year pursuant to any contract resulting from this RFP. This estimate is provided for informational purposes only, and no warranty or guarantee is given or implied as to the amount of tows a firm may conduct.

The intent of the specifications contained herein is to indicate minimum standards and requirements necessary for proper services as required by the City.

Nothing in these specifications shall be interpreted to limit the responsibilities of the Contractor from carrying out additional measures required to meet the intent and quality level specified.

Nothing contained herein shall prevent the owner or operator of a motor vehicle from calling a wrecker of their own choice or requesting that their vehicle be towed to a garage or storage compound other than that of the contract holder.

The City reserves the right to utilize certified divers on the City of Margate Fire Department's Dive Rescue Team to connect Contractor's extrication cables to any submerged or partially submerged vehicle located within a City waterway. In the event that a certified diver from the City's dive rescue team is not available or is otherwise unable to make such a connection, contractor shall provide a certified diver for such services at costs not exceeding the rates established herein.

### 2. <u>Minimum Requirements</u>

- a. Proposer shall be a holder of a general towing and wrecker service license, and must have been regularly engaged in the towing/wrecker/storage business for a minimum of five (5) years. The Proposer must indicate the exact location of the facility from which vehicles will be dispatched, and the location where towed vehicle storage will be provided if that location is separate from the dispatch location.
- b. All vehicles used during the term of this contract must contain a two-way radio communication system, to enable continuous direct contact with the vehicle driver from an office of the successful vendor
- c. The vehicles used shall be commercially manufactured, constructed, and equipped for the tow of vehicles within classifications herein specified. The vehicles, at all times, must be properly maintained and kept in a high degree of mechanical and safe operating condition.
- d. Vehicle operator/drivers must meet the following qualifications:
  - Possess a valid Commercial Driver's License of a class at or above the classification of the vehicle being operated.
  - 2) Have a detailed knowledge of the street names and street layout within the City.
  - 3) Shall be familiar with current traffic laws of the State of Florida and any additional traffic and/or M.O.T. standards set forth by the City of Margate regarding the operation of emergency equipment.
  - 4) Shall have the physical qualifications necessary to perform the normal tasks required to operate the various required equipment.
  - Must have on file with the towing provider a criminal history check conducted within the last two (2) year(s) prior to performing any towing services for the City of Margate. Such criminal history

checks must be available for review when requested by the City Manager or City's Police Department.

### 3. Required Equipment

- a. The vendor shall provide and maintain a minimum of ten (10) vehicles as follows:
  - 1) Six (6) Class "A" Wreckers including flatbed car carriers
  - 2) Two (2) Class "B" Wreckers
  - 3) Two (2) Class "C" Wreckers
  - 4) Special Equipment: Although preferred, there is no requirement for equipment such as Lowboy, air cushions or major street clean up equipment to be part of the Contractor's inventory. However, Contractor must demonstrate, to the satisfaction of the City, that such equipment is immediately available to him in the event that the need for such arises. Satisfaction of this requirement shall also include providing minimum specifications of the equipment for which the contractor is demonstrating availability.

Minimum required equipment on each wrecker is listed on Attachments D-F.

NOTE: The proposer (company) shall attach a list to their response of all equipment available to be used under this RFP. The list shall include at a minimum the following for each unit: Class, Unit # (if so identified); Model Year; Make and Type; Wrecker Capacity, and vehicle condition.

- b. Each vehicle class listed is as described and required by the Florida Highway Patrol.
- All vehicles shall be equipped to provide the service required in this type
  of work.
- d. The company must have a minimum of two (2) vehicles available to respond within twenty (20) minutes to an emergency scene, and a response time of no more than forty (40) minutes for non-emergency calls, on a twenty-four (24) hour basis to assist the City's Police or Fire Department.
- e. The list of equipment shall also include a description of all types of extraction equipment available to be used under this RFP to include the availability of low-pressure air bags or equivalent type of equipment for use in handling propane or flammable liquid tanker trucks, etc.

f. The company shall equip all vehicles with equipment needed to "clean" a scene of an accident as prescribed by State statute.

### 4. Storage Facility

- a. It shall be the responsibility of the Contractor to maintain an office, answering service or other type facility to receive telephone communications 24 hours per day, seven days per week, for immediate dispatch to location(s) as directed. The Contractor will maintain telephone communications 24 hours a day to answer calls from the City's Police Department, and public. The home storage yard and office shall be located within Broward County and must not be north of Hillsboro Boulevard or south of Oakland Park Boulevard. The location of the storage facility and office must meet the proper zoning requirements for such a storage facility. The storage facility must have both outside and inside storage, as described below.
- The Contractor shall provide an outside storage area that holds a b. minimum of one hundred (100) vehicles, properly spaced to provide access and removal of vehicles. The outside storage area will have lighting to reveal persons/vehicles at a minimum of 150 feet. The storage facility must be protected by an alarm system or guard dog, with a solid wall or substantial wire fence not less than six (6) feet in height. The fence shall screen the enclosed area from public view, the storage area fully illuminated, and barriers shall be affixed to the top of the fence to discourage access over the top. The Contractor shall provide a minimum of one (1) enclosed, secured storage units, capable of storing a minimum of three (3) vehicles inside as well as property of evidentiary value for law enforcement purposes only. This inside storage unit must comply with all applicable building and zoning requirements of the City for which it is The inside storage units will have lighting to reveal located. persons/vehicles at a minimum of 150 feet and will be weatherproof. The Contractor shall provide within the above described storage unit or within a secondary storage unit, a hydraulic lift to permit inspection of underside of vehicles. The inside storage unit(s) shall have paved floors, i.e., concrete or asphalt, free of dirt, standing water or vegetation. The work area must be a minimum of 8' x 20' per vehicle with at least an 81" ceiling. Each inside storage unit must have an electrical and lighting source sufficient to allow for the processing of a vehicle. Each inside storage facility shall be equipped with a twenty-four (24) hour surveillance system with the active capability of storing a minimum of thirty (30) days of recorded footage for each camera in operation. The Contractor does have the right to sub-contract with another storage facility to meet short-term demands due to an overflow of vehicles. The sub-contracted yard must be approved by the City and must meet the requirements for a storage facility as indicated within this agreement. The storage compound

shall be owned or leased by the Contractor. Such garage and storage facilities shall be capable of storing all vehicles towed by the company until these vehicles are lawfully reclaimed from the company or legally disposed of.

- c. The Contractor shall be responsible for all inventoried property at the moment the company's tow vehicle is attached to the "vehicle to be towed".
- d. Any area within the facility that is designated a police storage lot, will have the appropriate security fencing and will have working electronic surveillance system. The City's Police Department will conduct, at a minimum, annual CPTED (Crime Prevention through Environmental Design) security assessments. The Contractor will make every effort to complete any recommendation from the completed assessment.
- e. The Contractor shall be responsible for all vehicles and inventoried property therein while said vehicles are stored in the company storage facility and shall be prepared to release any vehicle between 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m., Monday through Saturday. The Contractor further agrees to provide on-call personnel to release vehicles between 7:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m. and on Sunday.
- f. The Contractor shall allow members of the City's Police Department to inspect its storage facility and the vehicles stored therein without previous notice.
- g. Owners of towed vehicles must be granted access to their vehicles in the storage compound during normal business hours. Access is limited to any lawful purpose including but not limited to inspection for insurance purposes. There shall be no charge attached to this access.
- h. The Contractor agrees to accept, at a minimum, the following forms of payment, at the storage compound and in the field (if necessary) from the public: Cash, at least one major credit card and any commercial business check or travelers check.

# 5. Business Conflict of Interest

- a. The Contractor shall not engage directly or indirectly or through any subsidiary or other entity in the following type ventures:
  - Automobile repair
  - 2) Automobile paint and body repair
  - 3) Salvage, junkyard or auto-recycling

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b. The above does not preclude the Contractor from sub-contracting with a storage facility for temporary storage of derelict vehicles.

# 6. Towing of City-Owned Vehicles

The Contractor shall provide all required towing and road service that may be required by the City of Margate in the operation and maintenance of its City owned and leased vehicles, including the City's police department, at no charge from sites within the limits of Broward County.

When such towing requirements are at the direction of authorized City personnel, for City owned, and leased vehicles outside of the limits of Broward County, the Contractor shall still be required to provide such services. In such case, Contractor may elect to charge the City a reasonable fee in keeping with the charges customarily levied to the general public for rendering towing and road services of equal kind.

# 7. Reporting Capability & Requirements

- a. The Contractor shall have the capability of producing information and status reports concerning each vehicle serviced by the company as may be required by the City's Police Department for policy purposes.
- b. Contractor shall submit reports to the City's police department designee, by the 15<sup>th</sup> of each month. The form of reports shall be determined by the Contractor, but are subject to the approval of the City.

Towing Activity Report, to include for each tow:

- 1) Date of tow.
- 2) Service call number assigned by the Police Department.
- Type of tow such as accident, parking, City vehicle, etc.
- 4) A complete breakdown of all towing charges, including sales taxes

Vehicle Release Report, to include:

- 1) All information contained in the Towing Activity Report.
- Date vehicle released or disposed of.
- 3) Method of disposition such as release to owner, release to Police, etc.
- 4) A complete breakdown of all towing charges, including sales taxes.

# 8. Impounded Vehicle Report

The Contractor will be provided an Impounded Vehicle Report (see sample – "Attachment C") by the City's Police Department. This form is used by the City's

Police Department and the towing company, to document vehicles and to inventory items contained therein.

# Fee to be Paid to the City

The successful proposer (Contractor) shall pay the City a service fee of at least \$30,000.00 annually, payable in advance in equal monthly installments. Proposers are encouraged to submit fee proposals in excess of the \$30,000.00 minimum. Proposers must complete Attachment B indicating the annual fee offered to the City.

Monthly payments shall be payable on the first day of each calendar month until the termination of the contract. If the payment is delinquent by more than fifteen (15) days after the payment is due, an additional charge of one hundred (\$100) dollars per day will be due for each day's delay in payment, retroactive to and beginning with the due date of the payment. In the event that a delinquent payment and resulting penalties are due, any payments received will first be applied to the penalty amount, prior to being applied to the regular monthly payment due. In this respect, the \$100 penalty fee shall accrue until the monthly payment and all applicable penalties are paid in full

# 10. Towing / Wrecker / Storage Charges to Public

A complete rate schedule must accompany this proposal (See Attachment A). The rates are those to be charged to the public and must be comprehensive and all-inclusive, containing rate charges for all types of towing, vehicle storage, additional equipment (dollies, etc.), and labor charges. Rates submitted in response to this RFP shall not exceed those already established by Broward County. However, for the purpose of evaluation, rates lower than those established by Broward County shall be given higher preference. Additional charges for trucks and unusual equipment shall be assessed only in accordance with a schedule of rates on file with the City's Police Department and approved by the City prior to posting.

A copy of the rate schedule for services provided by the company under this RFP shall be posted in clear public view for the length of the resulting contract in their home office, storage yard, etc. A copy should also be available in all units responding to calls from the City's Police Department. The City shall not be responsible for the collection of any charges from the public. Collection is the sole responsibility of the company.

These rates will be firm for the initial five (5) year period of the contract. Rates proposed are a factor in the Evaluation Criteria for this solicitation.

A request for tow rate adjustment by the Contractor must be made in writing to the City Manager ninety (90) days in advance of the contract renewal date. A

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request for an increased towing rate will also affect the fee paid to the City in an equal percentage increase.

When a vehicle is classified by the City's Police Department as "evidence" or ordered held "for investigative purposes", the Contractor shall not charge the owner, the City, or the City's Police Department for the cost of towing. In addition, no storage fees shall accrue until the applicable law enforcement agency and the State Attorney's Office formally releases the "hold" on the vehicle and/or property and Contractor has formally notified the owner via registered letter/return receipt requested. The storage time will begin in this instance on receipt of the registered letter.

#### 11. Bonding Requirement

Before commencing operations under a contract based on this RFP, the successful proposer (Contractor) shall furnish the City of Margate a Performance Bond for the life of the contract in an amount not less than the Contractor's proposed annual service fee, payable to the City of Margate should the company fail to perform as stipulated in this RFP and resulting agreement.

All bonds shall be in such form and executed by such sureties as are named in the current list of "Companies Holding Certificates of Authority as Acceptable Sureties on Federal Bonds and as acceptable Reinsuring Companies" as published in Circular 570 (amended) by the Financial Management Service, Surety Bond Branch, U.S. Department of the Treasury. All Bonds signed by an agent must be accompanied by a certified copy of such agent's authority to act.

The Performance Bond shall be obtained from surety or insurance companies that are duly licensed or authorized in the State of Florida.

The Performance Bond must contain a provision for notification to the City sixty (60) days in advance of bond cancellation.

The successful proposer (company) shall furnish to the City the required bond within ten (10) days after notification of award of contract.

# 12. Hold Harmless and Indemnification

Proposer covenants and agrees that it will indemnify and hold harmless the City and the City's contracted law enforcement provider, if applicable, and all of their officers, agents, and employees from any claim, loss, damage, cost, charge or expense arising out of any act, action, neglect or omission by the Proposer, whether direct or indirect, or whether to any person or property to which the City or said parties may be subject, except that neither the Proposer nor any of its subcontractors will be liable under this section for damages arising out of injury or damage to persons or property directly caused by or resulting from the sole

negligence of the City or the City's contracted law enforcement provider, if applicable, or any of their officers, agents or employees.

## 13. <u>Insurance</u>

The insurance described herein reflects the liability and other insurance requirements deemed necessary for this contract by the City. It is not necessary to have this level of insurance in effect at the time of submittal, but certificates indicating that the insurance is currently carried or a letter from the Carrier indicating upgrade ability will speed the review process to determine the most qualified Proposer.

The successful Proposer(s) shall not commence operations until certification or proof of insurance, detailing terms and provisions of coverage, has been received and approved by the City's Risk Manager. The following insurance coverage shall be required.

a. <u>Worker's Compensation Insurance</u> covering all employees and providing benefits as required by Florida Statute, Chapter 440, regardless of the size of the company (number of employees). The Contractor further agrees to be responsible for employment, control and conduct of its employees and for any injury sustained by such employees in the course of their employment.

# b. <u>Liability Insurance</u>

- Naming the City of Margate as an additional insured, on General Liability Insurance only, in connection with work being done under this contract.
- Such Liability insurance shall include the types of insurance indicated on the attached sample certificate of insurance marked "Attachment G"

The certification or proof of insurance must contain a provision for notification to the City, and the City's police department, thirty (30) days in advance of any material change in coverage or cancellation. Contractor shall be in breach of contract if insurance coverage as required by the City is not maintained at all times during the duration of the contract period.

The successful Proposer shall furnish to the City the certification or proof of insurance required by the provisions set forth above, within ten (10) days after notification of intent to award the contract.

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# 14. Retention of Records and Right to Access

The selected firm shall maintain during the term of the contract all books of account, receipt invoices, reports and records in accordance with generally accepted accounting practices and standards. The form of all records and reports shall be subject to the approval of the City's Internal Auditor. The selected firm must comply with recommendation for changes, additions, or deletions by the City's Internal Auditor. The City's Internal Auditor must be permitted during normal business hours to audit and examine the books of account, reports, and records relating to this contract. The selected firm shall maintain and make available such records and files for the duration of the contract and retain them beyond the last day of the contract term for the period of three (3) years following contract expiration.

# 15. Communications

No negotiations, decisions, or actions shall be initiated or executed by the firm because of any discussions with any City employee. Only those communications, which are in writing from the City, may be considered as a duly authorized expression on behalf of the City. In addition, only communications from firms that are signed and in writing will be recognized by the City as duly authorized expressions on behalf of firms.

# 16. No Discrimination

There shall be no discrimination as to race, sex, color, creed, or national origin in the operations conducted under this contract.

# 17. Independent Contractor

The selected firm shall be deemed an independent Contractor for all purposes, and the employees of the Contractor or any of its contractors, subcontractors and the employees thereof, shall not in any manner be deemed to be employees of City. As such, the employees of the Contractor, its Contractors or subcontractors, shall not be subject to any withholding for tax, social security or other purposes by City, nor shall such Contractor, subcontractor, or employee be entitled to sick leave, pension benefits, vacation, medical benefits, life insurance, workers, unemployment compensation, or the like from City.

# 18. Staff Assignment

The City of Margate reserves the right to approve or reject, for any reasons, Proposer's staff assigned to this assigned to work under this service contract at any time. Background checks shall be required.

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#### 19. Contract Terms

The contract shall include, but not be limited to the following terms:

The contract shall include as a minimum, the entirety of this RFP document, together with the successful Proposer's proposal. Contract shall be prepared by the City of Margate.

If the City of Margate defends any claim, demand, cause of action, or lawsuit arising out of any act, action, negligent acts or negligent omissions, or willful misconduct of the contractor, its employees, agents or servants during the performance of the contract, whether directly or indirectly, contractor agrees to reimburse the City of Margate for all expenses, attorney's fees, and court costs incurred in defending such claim, cause of action or lawsuit.

#### 20. Waiver

It is agreed that no waiver or modification of this contract or of any covenant, condition or limitation contained in it shall be valid unless it is in writing and duly executed by the party to be charged with it, and that no evidence of any waiver or modification shall be offered or received in evidence in any proceeding, arbitration, or litigation between the parties arising out of or affecting this contract, or the right or obligations of any party under it, unless such waiver or modification is in writing, duly executed as above. The parties agree that the provisions of this paragraph may not be waived except by a duly executed writing.

# 21. Survivorship Rights

This contract shall be binding on and inure to the benefit of the respective parties and their executors, administrators, heirs, personal representative, successors and assigns.

# 22. Termination

The contract may be terminated by the City of Margate without cause upon providing contractor with a least thirty (30) days prior written notice.

Should either party fail to perform any of its obligations under this contract for a period of thirty (30) days after receipt of written notice of such failure, the non-defaulting party will have the right to terminate the contract immediately upon delivery of written notice to the defaulting party of its election to do so. The foregoing rights of termination are in addition to any other rights and remedies that such party may have.

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#### 23. Manner of Performance

Proposer agrees to perform its duties and obligations under this contract in a professional manner and in accordance with all applicable local, federal, and state laws, rules, and regulations.

Proposer agrees that the services provided under this contract shall be provided by employees that are educated, trained and experienced, certified and licensed in all areas encompassed within their designated duties. Proposer agrees to furnish the City of Margate with all documentation, certification, authorization, license, permit, or registration currently required by applicable laws or rules and regulations. Proposer further certifies that it and its employees are now in and will maintain good standing with such governmental agencies and that it and its employees will keep all license, permits, registration, authorization or certification required by applicable laws or regulations in full force and effect during the term of this contract. Failure of proposer to comply with this paragraph shall constitute a material breach of contract.

# 24. Submission/Format Requirements

Where the agreement is terminated for the convenience of the city the notice of termination to the successful proposer must state that the contract is being terminated for the convenience of the city under the termination clause and the extent of the termination. Upon receipt of such notice, the contractor shall promptly discontinue all work at the time and to the extent indicated on the notice of termination, terminate all outstanding sub-contractors and purchase orders to the extent that they relate to the terminated portion of the contract and refrain from placing further orders and subcontracts except as they may be necessary, and complete any continued portions of the work.

Successful offeror understands and agrees that City is purchasing the equipment in reliance upon the skill of successful offeror in furnishing the equipment suitable for the purpose stated. J & J Towing had 5 invoices that had incorrect charges. Some of the charges were less then the contracted price.

On February 4, 2008 a 2003 Ford Mustang was placed on hold by the City of Coral Springs. A cluster of gauges were missing from the Mustang. Coral Springs Police Department launched an investigation with the Margate Police Department. Margate PD could not verify if the gauges were lost from the vehicle in transit to the yard or cut and removed from the vehicle.

Coral Springs terminated the contract with J & J Towing before the investigation was completed.

On Wednesday, November 27, 2007, Sgt Barbuto and I conducted an unannounced inspection of J&J Towing records in accordance with the recommendations made in the current contract quality review report dated October 11, 2007.

Ten tow invoices were randomly selected from the calendar year 2007. The following tows were reviewed and possible deficiencies are listed.

- 1. Invoice 167733, dated 08-04-07. Vehicle was brought into the tow yard after hours and was released the next day. A \$30 admin fee was charged. This was a result of a computer error that read vehicle towed on 08-04-07 and released on 08-05-07. The computer read this as being over 24 hours and mistakenly charges the fee.
- 2. Invoice 160797, dated 08-02-07. Vehicle was charged a \$20 mileage fee. This fee is not listed under the contract's table of approved fees. The correct way should have been to charge \$55 labor for every 30 minutes the driver was towing the vehicle to the requested location. Due to the fact the tow company under-charged the owner, no action is deemed necessary. Tow company owner was made aware of this situation

- 3. Invoice 161320, dated 06-20-07. Tow log showed the vehicle being stored for 10 days but being charged for 14 days. Invoice shows the owner released the vehicle on 06-29-07 to Progressive Insurance, but Progressive did not pickup vehicle until the 14<sup>th</sup> day. Charges are acceptable under the contract.
- 4. Invoice 158200, dated 04-19-07. Tow log shows a \$24 storage fee and a \$30 administrative fee. The vehicle was stored less than 24 hours. The computer read this as a full day of storage and mistakenly charged the listed fees.
- 5. Invoice 160049, dated 03-08-07. There is an \$80 delivery charge listed on the tow log. The impound slip states vehicle was released to the owner. Tow company owner stated the vehicle was delivered to the owner's house. There is no way to determine if this is correct. The owner has not called in a complaint.
- 6. The other five invoices did not have any discrepancies.

The tow company owner was shown the listed deficiencies and we all were able to determine that the computer program was in error. The owner stated she would correct future problems.

Due to this favorable review, it is the opinion of the Traffic Unit that J & J Towing should be allowed to begin towing again starting with the next rotation, which will start on December 1, 2007.

On February 4, 2008 Traffic Homicide Investigator Eric Schuster contacted me in reference to parts missing off a 2003 Ford, Mustang, bearing Florida license plate UID5R. The vehicle was at J & J Towing and was on hold in reference to case #08-400440, which was a possible fatality investigation. Investigator Schuster had responded to J & J Towing to process the vehicle. Upon processing the vehicle he noticed that there was an instrument cluster that was removed from the vehicle. Photographs were previously taken of the vehicle showing the instrument cluster (see attached photos).

It was clear from the examination of the vehicle that the wires holding the instrument cluster on the vehicle were cut with some type of wire cutter as evidence by the photographs taken by Investigator Schuster. This vehicle was not store inside as requested by the investigator because the tow operator could not access the inside storage bay.

The victim survived, so we avoided a potential serious loss of evidence in our investigation. However, had this vehicle been crucial in our case, the chain of custody of the vehicle and the evidentiary value of the vehicle would be in question. Contact was made with Margate Police Department and a grand theft report was made. Margate Police Department case number is 1-08-007974.

On October 21, 2007 J & J Towing was suspended for 30 days because they were not meeting their contractual services. (See attached)

Vehicles that are evidence and placed on hold weather for a traffic homicide case or criminal case can not be jeopardize. A vendor we rely upon to secure our evidence can not jeopardize evidence that is essential to a criminal investigation.

Due to this incident and previous violations, I am hereby recommending that the contractual service of J & J Towing be terminated.

I met with Coral Springs Police Officer E. Schuster #567 at J & J Towing, in reference to someone had stolen a part (Autometer-Phantom Series- a pillar 3-gauge Cluster) off of a vehicle (2003 Black Ford Mustang Cobra, FL tag UID5R) that their department had towed and had placed a "Hold" on 02/04/08 (CSPD Traffic Homicide Case #08-400440). Officer Schuster stated that the traffic crash broke the Gauge Cluster off of its mount and was hanging off of the car by its wires. He stated that the stolen gauges are valued at approx. \$320.00 I photographed the crime scene and recovered a latent print off of the driver's side a-pillar, near where the Gauge Cluster had been attached. The wires to the gauge appeared to have been cut. The photographs were placed on the server and the latent print was placed into evidence. J & J tow truck driver, Jimmy Trenard stated that he had towed the vehicle to the compound that night and had left the vehicle parked outdoors in the compound. I then spoke with J & J truck driver, Thomas Lindsey. He stated the he and his brother, Williams Lyons, had moved the vehicle into the garage, the following day. The video surveillance system in the yard, is not working. The vehicle tag (FL UID5R) was not assigned to the vehicle or to the registered owner. The registered owner's name was Fernando Calero and the tag was registered to a Christopher Dorman. The tow slip lists Dorman as the driver. CSPD Officer Schuster believes that Dorman is still in the hospital, from the accident. I have not spoken with either Dorman or Calero. At this time, the registered owner is listed as the victim.

In contacting Officer Eric Schuster of the Coral Springs Police Department I was provided with two photographs that show the Mustang's instrument cluster and its wires intact after the crash. The cluster of instruments was shown hanging from the driver's side roof support after the roof support was cut in half by EMS. The photographs were taken at the scene prior to the car being towed by J&J towing to their impound lot.

In going to J&J I examined the car and found the wires to the gauges were cleanly cut and not frayed from falling off in transport. While at the tow company I spoke with the driver, Jimmy Trenard, who towed the Mustang in on February 4th. He advised that did not recall seeing the instrument cluster that evening. He further advised that he did not examine the car very closely that night and after arriving at the tow yard he found that there was no room in their traffic homicide bays for the car. As a result he covered the Mustang while it was on the flatbed and left the flatbed in J&J's enclosed compound. Trenard stated that after he towed the car in, it was the end of his shift and he went home for the night.

J&J employee, Eddie Raffone, replaced Trenard at the tow yard that evening. He remained at the tow complex that night but left to do tows as needed. He said that the complex is secure and he was unaware if anyone could have gained access that night.

The morning after Trenard towed the car in, J&J employees, Thomas Lindsay and William Lyons, reported that the car was uncovered upon their arrival and after approximately a half hour, they placed it into a bay. Neither employee reported seeing the gauges. Lyons said that he was curious if it was a genuine Cobra so he examined the exterior. He advised that he is sure he would have seen the gauges hanging from the roof support had they been there at the time. During that time he did not see anyone by the vehicle. He believes that they placed it into the bay around 8 AM.

On 02/14/08 I spoke to Trooper John Baker of the Florida Highway Patrol. He stated that he was at J&J at approximately 10:30 AM that morning and without touching or molesting the Mustang he looked in to see if the speedometer froze at the time of impact because it was such a severely damaged vehicle. Trooper Baker stated that he did not see the hanging cluster of gauges.

I obtained a list of all the all of the other workers that worked on the morning that the Mustang was towed in. All employees were checked for warrants with negative results. The employees were as follows;

Allan York (05-13-74). York quit the week after the theft occurred. I interviewed him on 03-03-08 at his residence in Pompano. He stated that he saw the car after it was removed from the flatbed but said he did not see the gauges. He did

not recall what time he observed the car.

Mikhael Selezney (02-03-70). He advised that he works in dispatch and believed the car was on the truck that morning but does not have a clear recollection of that day and usually is inside of the building.

Tony Mora (02-08-38). He stated that he works in the garage and does not recall seeing that car when it came in but later saw it after the gauges were reported missing.

Damadrick Hugley (07-13-80). Hugley said that he comes in at 9 AM and only saw the car after the theft was discovered. Marc Bouthillette (12-30-64). Bouthillette said that he had not yet arrived to work when the car was unloaded and only saw the car several days later when it was in the bay. Omar Eldridge (05-07-78) He advised that he came in at 8AM and only saw the car several days later after it was in the traffic homicide bays.


Jeff Pope (05-31-69) Pope stated that he arrived for work at 10 AM and only saw that car several days later after it was in the traffic homicide bay.


Cavin Sanders (07-20-66) Sanders starts work at 6 PM and said he saw the car several days after it was towed in and never looked at it very closely.




With this information it appears as though the theft occurred between 0730 and 0800 hours. Each employee was questioned concerning their seeing anyone by the Mustang but they all advised that they did not see anyone by the car. Although Trenard reported that he covered the Mustang after he towed it in, none of the employees that were interviewed admitted to uncovering the car.


There was no operating video surveillance system in place at the time of the theft. As of this date it has not been determined who stole the gauges. Case is being suspended pending further investigative leads.


