It brings me great joy to watch as people line the street and dance as we march by. People of all ages clapping and smiling, enjoying the music our band is performing; this is my greatest pleasure and reward. At the end of the parade, we walk back to the "staging area" and people stop me to tell me how great we sounded, how our music brought back wonderful memories and feelings of patriotism. In 2014, my high school marching band director passed away suddenly. All my energy and time went into keeping his memory alive and accomplishing the great music we performed together. People thanked me for keeping his spirit, keeping his tradition and dedication going. Music touches people in many ways. I'm happiest knowing that people are happy when they hear me play and that my efforts and hard work have touched and helped so many others to feel the same way.

During our summer vacation, my band had the month of July off. To keep our drumline in top shape, I personally organized practice sessions at my house with all 10 drummers. We set up a tent, served refreshments and snacks and practiced. Neighbors stopped by. Drivers and strangers stopped to hear the music. One gentleman got out of his car holding drumsticks and asked if he could join in. It was the best of what music is; bringing people together with a personal touch. It was all about the love of music and the joy of entertaining!

Beyond my own musical growth and sharing with my band members, I discovered the joy and fulfillment that comes with teaching. Getting involved in teaching and organizing elementary school drumlines has been my greatest accomplishment. Sharing skills, excitement and music with younger students, seeing the excitement in their faces as they learned and performed, has been one of my proudest accomplishments.

Teaching an elementary school drumline last year I discovered how rewarding it was to share my knowledge and excitement with younger musicians. I will always remember the smiles of accomplishment and pride on their faces as they performed what they had learned. Everyone was smiling from ear to ear including me, knowing what we had accomplished to get to this point and how much we could improve with practice. After our final performance many of the parents came up to thank me. My accomplishment and sharing was my own best reward.

My musical journey has taught me the greatest lesson of all; one that great talents and Americans like Bob Hope always knew. It is not so much what you know and can do, but how well you share it with others to enrich their lives.
