AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MARGATE, FLORIDA, AMENDING CHAPTER 23-LANDSCAPING, ARTICLE 1. - IN GENERAL, SECTION 23-12 - MAINTENANCE OF LANDSCAPING AND AMENDING APPENDIX A ZONING, ARTICLE XL SECTION 40.9 - LANDSCAPE MAINTENANCE REQUIREMENTS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF MARGATE, FLORIDA:

<u>Section 1:</u> Chapter 23-Landscaping, Article 1. - In General, Section 23-12 - Maintenance of Landscaping, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 23-12. - Maintenance of landscaping.

- (A) General.
 - (1) Responsible party.
 - (a) The owner or owners, together with their tenants and individuals or entities legally in control or responsible for real property, shall be jointly and severally responsible for the maintenance of all landscaping existing or which previously had been installed on any developed site which they own or control within the city.

(2) Requirements.

- (a) All landscaping shall be maintained in a healthy and growing condition.
- (b) All cuttings not shredded for use as mulch onsite shall be disposed of properly and removed from the site. Grass clippings and other yard waste are not permitted to be disposed of within any storm drain.
- (c) All trash container and dumpster areas shall be maintained so as to prevent the runover of refuse.
- (d) Walls, fences and curbing shall be maintained free of breaks, decay and stains.

(3) Encroaching on property of others.

No person shall permit any tree, bush, shrub, or other vegetation growing on his property to grow so as to encroach upon any adjacent parcel of property without permission of the adjacent property owner. Permission of the adjacent property owner shall be presumed where the encroachment is tolerated without written objection delivered to the owner of the encroaching vegetation. Where a tree, bush or shrub located on one parcel of property encroaches on another parcel of property through the growing of branches, vines, stems or other extensions of such tree, bush or shrub, then, and in

that event, the property owner upon whose property the tree,
bush or shrub encroaches shall have the right to trim or prune
the encroaching portion of such tree, bush or shrub, provided
that such trimming or pruning is conducted in compliance with
the requirements of any and all City regulations regarding
tree abuse, tree trimming or tree pruning. Nothing in this
section shall be deemed to require that any tree, bush or
shrub be pruned or trimmed in a manner that would constitute
tree abuse or violate any other section of this Code or the
City's Land Development Code. This section shall not be
enforced against the owner of any tree, bush or shrub if the
adjacent property owner fails to allow entry onto his property
for the purpose of maintaining the vegetation. This section
shall not apply to any vegetation growing on property owned or
maintained by the City or any other government entity, except
that the adjacent property owner may trim or prune the
encroaching vegetation.

Section 2: Appendix A Zoning, Article XL Section 40.9 - Landscape Maintenance Requirements, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 40.9. - Landscaping maintenance requirements.

All owners of land shall be responsible for the maintenance of all landscaping. This includes mowing and maintaining abutting

1	rights-of-way, swales, lake and canal banks. Landscaping shall
2	be maintained in a good condition so as to present a healthy,
3	neat and orderly appearance at least equal to the original
4	installation and shall be mowed or trimmed in a manner and at
5	a frequency so as not to detract from the appearance of the
6	general area. Landscaping shall be maintained such that it
7	will not cause property damage and public safety hazards,
8	including removal of living, dead or decaying plant material,
9	removal of low hanging branches below twelve (12) feet above
10	grade and those obstructing street lighting. Landscaping shall
11	be maintained in accordance with the following standards:

(a) Insects, disease, etc.: Landscaping shall be kept free of visible signs of insects and disease and appropriately irrigated and fertilized to enable landscaping to be in a healthy condition.

- (b) Mulching: Three (3) inches of clean, weed-free, appropriately sterilized organic mulch shall be maintained over all areas originally mulched at all times until landscaped area matures to one hundred (100) coverage.
- (c) Turf edge trimming: All roadways, curbs and sidewalks shall be edged to prevent encroachment from the adjacent turfed areas.

1	(d) Maintenance of irrigation systems: Irrigation systems
2	shall be maintained to eliminate water loss due to damaged,
3	missing or improperly operating sprinkler heads, emitters,
4	pipes and all other portions of the irrigation system and
5	shall not be installed or operated to place water on roads.
6	(e) Replacement requirements: An owner is responsible to
7	ensure that living material are replaced with like material if
8	such living material or trees die, or are abused.
9	(f) Removal of root systems: Removal of root systems which
10	show evidence of destroying public or private property is
11	required.
12	(g) Tree abuse: Tree abuse is prohibited within the City in
13	accordance with section 23-16 of the City of Margate Code of
14	Ordinances.
15	(h) Tree pruning:
16	(1) All owners of land must prune trees in accordance
17	with the National Arborist Association Standards. Any
18	pruning performed without conformance to the National
19	Arborist Association Standards shall be subject to

No person shall permit any tree, bush, shrub, or other vegetation growing on his property to grow so as to encroach upon any adjacent parcel of property without permission of the adjacent property owner. Permission of the adjacent property owner shall be presumed where the encroachment is tolerated without written objection delivered to the owner of the encroaching vegetation. SECTION 4: If any section, sentence, clause, or phrase of this ordinance is held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, then said holding shall in no way affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance. SECTION 5: It is the intention of the City Commission that the provisions of this ordinance shall become and be made a part of the City of Margate Code, and that the sections of this ordinance may be renumbered or relettered and the word "ordinance" may be changed to "section", "article" or such other appropriate word or phrase in order to accomplish such intentions. SECTION 6: This ordinance shall become effective immediately upon adoption at its second reading.
