WHEREAS, LLS maintains an office in Hollywood to help improve the quality of life for blood cancer patients and their families in the State of Florida; and

WHEREAS, Margate is similarly committed to the eradication of these diseases and supports the treatment of blood cancer patients and their families; and

WHEREAS, Margate encourages private efforts to enhance research funding and education programs that are saving lives not someday, but today.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Tommy Ruzzano, Mayor of the City of Margate, joins with LLS in designating the month of September 2016, as

BLOOD CANCER AWARENESS MONTH

and urge all citizens to educate themselves about the need for finding cures and creating access to treatments for all types of blood cancers; to get involved with LLS, from participating in fundraising campaigns, to making a donation or volunteering; and to fund lifesaving research to advance breakthrough therapies for blood cancer patients.
