- An arrangement whereby the person who owns or rents (a) the home provides room, board, and personal services for not more than two adults who do not receive 409.212, optional state supplementation under Sec. F.S. The person who provides the housing, meals, and personal care must own or rent the home and reside therein.
- An arrangement whereby the person who owns or rents (b) the home provides room, board, and personal services only to his or her relatives.
- An establishment that is licensed as an (C) assisted living facility under Chapter 429, Florida Statutes.

Assisted living facility: Any building or buildings, section or distinct part of a building, private home, boarding home, home for the aged, or other residential facility, whether operated for profit or not, which undertakes through its ownership or management to provide housing, meals, and one or more personal services for a period exceeding 24 hours to one who are not relatives of or more adults the owner or administrator.

Community residential home: A dwelling unit licensed to serve residents who are clients of the Department of Elderly Affairs, the Agency for Persons with Disabilities, the Department of Juvenile Justice, or the Department of Children and Families or licensed by the Agency for Health Care Administration.

Community residential home, Type 1: A dwelling unit that provides a living environment for homes of six or fewer residents which otherwise meet the definition of a community

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1 residential home shall be deemed a single-family unit and a 2 noncommercial, residential use. Homes of six or fewer 3 residents which otherwise meet the definition of a community 4 residential home shall be allowed in single-family or 5 multifamily zoning districts without approval by the City, 6 provided that such homes are not located within a radius of 7 1,000 feet of another Type 1 home or within a radius of 1,200 feet of another Type 2 home. Such homes with six or fewer 8 9 residents are not required to comply with the notification 10 provisions of Chapter 419, Florida Statutes; provided that, 11 before licensure, the sponsoring agency provides the City 12 with the most recently published data compiled from the 13 licensing entities that identifies all community residential 14 homes within the jurisdictional limits of the City in which 15 the proposed site is to be located in order to show that 16 there is not another Type 1 home within a radius of 1,000 17 feet and not another Type 2 home within a radius of 1,200 18 feet of the proposed home. At the time of home occupancy, the sponsoring agency must notify the City that the home is 19 20 licensed by the licensing entity. For purposes of City land 21 use and zoning determinations, this definition does not 22 affect the legal nonconforming use status of any community 23 residential home lawfully permitted and operating as of July 24 1, 2016.

Community residential home, Type 2: A dwelling unit meeting the definition of community residential home which provides a living environment for seven to 14 unrelated residents who operate as the functional equivalent of a family, including such supervision and care by supportive staff as may be necessary to meet the physical, emotional, and social needs of the residents. Type 2 homes shall not be located within 1,000 feet of another Type 1 home and within 1,200 feet of

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another Type 2 home. For purposes of City land use and zoning determinations, this definition does not affect the legal nonconforming use status of any community residential home lawfully permitted and operating as of July 1, 2016.

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Detoxification: A service involving subacute care that is provided on an inpatient or outpatient basis to assist individuals to withdraw from the physiological and psychological effects of substance abuse and who meet the placement criteria provided in Chapter 397, Florida Statutes.

Detoxification facility: A facility licensed to provide detoxification services under Chapter 397, Florida Statutes.

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Family care facilities: A facility which provides residence, supervision, and support in a family setting to eight (8) or fewer unrelated individuals who are handicapped, aged, disabled, or in need of adult supervision.

Group care facilities: A facility which provides residence, and/or supervision and services for individuals who are handicapped, aged, disabled, or undergoing rehabilitation including nursing homes, sober houses, halfway houses, convalescent homes, homes for the aged, foster and boarding homes, and retirement homes, whether the residents' stay are mandated or voluntary. The city shall ensure that no group care facilities are located within a one-thousand-foot radius of any other group care facilities located in any of

1 the residentially zoned areas within the city. The onethousand-foot radius will be used to provide a minimum 2 3 separation of group care facilities needed to effectively preserve the residential neighborhoods of the city while 4 5 also ensuring that disabled individuals inhabiting group 6 care facilities experience a true neighborhood lifestyle. 7 8 Hospital: A hospital licensed under Chapter 395, F.S., and 9 Part II of Chapter 408, Florida Statutes. 10 11 12 13 Long-term care facility: A nursing home facility, assisted living facility, adult family-care home, or any other similar 14 residential adult care facility that provides rehabilitative, 15 restorative, and/or ongoing skilled nursing care to patients 16 or residents in need of assistance with activities of daily 17 18 living. 19 20 21 Nursing home: A home for aged, chronically ill, or incurable 22 persons in which three (3) or more persons not of the immediate family are received, kept, or provided with food 23 24 and shelter or care for compensation, but not including 25 hospitals, clinics or similar institutions devoted primarily 26 to the diagnosis and treatment of the sick or injured. 27 . . . 28 29 Nursing home facility: Any licensed facility which provides 30 nursing services as defined in Part I of Chapter 464, Florida 31 Statutes. 32 33

Recovery residence: A residential dwelling unit, or other form of group housing, that is offered or advertised through any means, including oral, written, electronic, or printed means, by any person or entity as a residence that provides a peer-supported, alcohol-free and drug-free living environment. The number of unrelated residents and distance requirements set forth by Type 1 and Type 2 community residential homes shall apply to these facilities.

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Special residential facility, category (2): A housing facility which is licensed by the State of Florida for nine (9) to sixteen (16) non-elderly individuals who require treatment, care, rehabilitation or education. This includes individuals who are dependent children, physically disabled, developmentally disabled or individuals not overtly (sic) of harm to themselves or others. The facility provides a family living environment including supervision and care necessary to meet the physical, emotional and social needs of the individuals. It may or may not provide education or training. There may be more than one (1) kitchen within the housing facility.

Special residential facility, category (3): Shall mean the following:

- (a) Any housing facility licensed by the State of Florida for more than sixteen (16) non-elderly individuals who require treatment, care, rehabilitation or education. This includes individuals who are dependent children, physically disabled, developmentally disabled or individuals not overtly (sic) of harm to themselves or others; or
 - (b) Any housing facility licensed by the State of Florida for more than eight (8) unrelated elderly individuals; or
- (c) Governmentally subsidized housing facilities entirely devoted to the care of the elderly, dependent

children, physically handicapped, developmentally disabled or individuals not overtly of harm to themselves or others; or Any not-for-profit housing facility for unrelated (d) elderly individuals; or (e) Any housing facility which provides a life-care environment. Life-care environment shall include, but is not limited to, creation of a life estate in the facility itself and provision of off-site or on-site medical care. SECTION 13: This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon adoption at its second reading.
