AN ORDINANCE OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF MARGATE, FLORIDA, AMENDING CHAPTER 31 - PLATTING, SUBDIVISION AND OTHER LAND USE REGULATIONS, SECTION 31-33 DEFINITIONS; APPENDIX-A ZONING; SECTION 2.2 TERMS DEFINED; ARTICLE XIV ONE FAMILY DWELLING R-1A TO R-1B DISTRICT, SECTION 14.2 USES PERMITTED; ARTICLE XV TWO FAMILY DWELLING R-2 DISTRICT, SECTION 15.2 USES PERMITTED; ARTICLE XVI MULTIPLE FAMILY DWELLING R-3 DISTRICT, SECTION 16.2 USES PERMITTED; ARTICLE XXII COMMUNITY BUSINESS B-2 DISTRICT, SECTION 22.3 PERMITTED USES; ARTICLE XXIII LIBERAL BUSINESS B-3 DISTRICT, SECTION 23.3 PERMITTED USES; ARTICLE VII TRANSIT ORIENTED CORRIDOR - CORRIDOR TOC-C DISTRICT, SECTION 7.3 PERMITTED USES; ARTICLE XI COMMUNITY FACILITY CF-1 DISTRICT, SECTION 11.3 PERMITTED USES; PROVIDING FOR MINIMUM STANDARDS; PROVIDING FOR CONSISTENCY WITH FLORIDA STATUTES; PROVIDING FOR REPEAL; PROVIDING FOR EXCEPTIONS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

SECTION 1: The Code of the City of Margate, Florida, Appendix-A Zoning, Section 2.2, Terms Defined, is hereby amended to read as follows¹:

Sec. 2.2 - Terms defined.

Adult family-care home: A full-time, family-type living arrangement, in a private home, under which a person who owns or rents the home provides room, board, and personal care, on a 24-hour basis, for no more than five disabled adults or frail elders who are not relatives. The following family-type living arrangements are not required to be licensed as an adult family-care home:

2 (a) An arrangement whereby the person who owns or rents
3 the home provides room, board, and personal services
4 for not more than two adults who do not receive
5 optional state supplementation under Sec. 409.212,
6 F.S. The person who provides the housing, meals, and
7 personal care must own or rent the home and reside
8 therein.

10 (b) An arrangement whereby the person who owns or rents
11 the home provides room, board, and personal services
12 only to his or her relatives.

14 (c) An establishment that is licensed as an assisted
15 living facility under Chapter 429, Florida Statutes.

18 Assisted living facility: Any building or buildings, section
19 or distinct part of a building, private home, boarding home,
20 home for the aged, or other residential facility, whether
21 operated for profit or not, which undertakes through its
22 ownership or management to provide housing, meals, and one or
23 more personal services for a period exceeding 24 hours to one
24 or more adults who are not relatives of the owner or
25 administrator.

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28 Community residential home: A dwelling unit licensed to serve
29 residents who are clients of the Department of Elderly
30 Affairs, the Agency for Persons with Disabilities, the
31 Department of Juvenile Justice, or the Department of Children
32 and Families or licensed by the Agency for Health Care
33 Administration.

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37 Community residential home, Type 1: A dwelling unit that
38 provides a living environment for homes of six or fewer
39 residents which otherwise meet the definition of a community

1 residential home shall be deemed a single-family unit and a
2 noncommercial, residential use. Homes of six or fewer
3 residents which otherwise meet the definition of a community
4 residential home shall be allowed in single-family or
5 multifamily zoning districts without approval by the City,
6 provided that such homes are not located within a radius of
7 1,000 feet of another Type 1 home or within a radius of 1,200
8 feet of another Type 2 home. Such homes with six or fewer
9 residents are not required to comply with the notification
10 provisions of Chapter 419, Florida Statutes; provided that,
11 before licensure, the sponsoring agency provides the City
12 with the most recently published data compiled from the
13 licensing entities that identifies all community residential
14 homes within the jurisdictional limits of the City in which
15 the proposed site is to be located in order to show that
16 there is not another Type 1 home within a radius of 1,000
17 feet and not another Type 2 home within a radius of 1,200
18 feet of the proposed home. At the time of home occupancy, the
19 sponsoring agency must notify the City that the home is
20 licensed by the licensing entity. For purposes of City land
21 use and zoning determinations, this definition does not
22 affect the legal nonconforming use status of any community
23 residential home lawfully permitted and operating as of July
24 1, 2016.

28 Community residential home, Type 2: A dwelling unit meeting
29 the definition of community residential home which provides a
30 living environment for seven to 14 unrelated residents who
31 operate as the functional equivalent of a family, including
32 such supervision and care by supportive staff as may be
33 necessary to meet the physical, emotional, and social needs
34 of the residents. Type 2 homes shall not be located within
35 1,000 feet of another Type 1 home and within 1,200 feet of

another Type 2 home. For purposes of City land use and zoning determinations, this definition does not affect the legal nonconforming use status of any community residential home lawfully permitted and operating as of July 1, 2016.

Detoxification: A service involving subacute care that is provided on an inpatient or outpatient basis to assist individuals to withdraw from the physiological and psychological effects of substance abuse and who meet the placement criteria provided in Chapter 397, Florida Statutes.

Detoxification facility: A facility licensed to provide detoxification services under Chapter 397, Florida Statutes.

~~Family care facilities:~~ A facility which provides residence, supervision, and support in a family setting to eight (8) or fewer unrelated individuals who are handicapped, aged, disabled, or in need of adult supervision.

~~Group care facilities:~~ A facility which provides residence, and/or supervision and services for individuals who are handicapped, aged, disabled, or undergoing rehabilitation including nursing homes, sober houses, halfway houses, convalescent homes, homes for the aged, foster and boarding homes, and retirement homes, whether the residents' stay are mandated or voluntary. The city shall ensure that no group care facilities are located within a one-thousand-foot radius of any other group care facilities located in any of

1 ~~the residentially zoned areas within the city. The one-~~
2 ~~thousand-foot radius will be used to provide a minimum~~
3 ~~separation of group care facilities needed to effectively~~
4 ~~preserve the residential neighborhoods of the city while~~
5 ~~also ensuring that disabled individuals inhabiting group~~
6 ~~care facilities experience a true neighborhood lifestyle.~~

9 Hospital: A hospital licensed under Chapter 395, F.S., and
10 Part II of Chapter 408, Florida Statutes.

14 living facility, adult family-care home, or any other similar
15 residential adult care facility that provides rehabilitative,
16 restorative, and/or ongoing skilled nursing care to patients
17 or residents in need of assistance with activities of daily

21 ~~Nursing home: A home for aged, chronically ill, or incurable~~
22 ~~persons in which three (3) or more persons not of the~~

1 Recovery residence: A residential dwelling unit, or other

4 means, by any person or entity as a residence that provides a
5 peer-supported, alcohol-free and drug-free living
6 environment. The number of unrelated residents and distance
7 requirements set forth by Type 1 and Type 2 community
8 residential homes shall apply to these facilities.

(4) Recovery residence, as defined in Section 2.2

~~(B) Special exception uses: The following is authorized upon a finding by the city commission that a special exception to this article is warranted. Upon requesting said special exception by the city commission, the applicant must submit a boundary survey and legal description of the property involved, the proposed location of all buildings, accessways, open space and recreational facilities, accessory uses, fences and signage, screening and landscaping, lighting, and a conceptual paving, drainage and utility plan. The development review committee shall approve applicable site plan prior to consideration by the city commission.~~

SECTION 9: The Code of the City of Margate, Florida, Chapter 31 - Platting, Subdivision and Other Land Use Regulations, Article III Development Review, Section 31-33 Definitions is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 31-33. - Definitions.

As used in this article:

Building permit means:

- (1) Any permit for the erection or construction of a new building required by the South Florida Building Code, or other building code in force and effect at the time.
- (2) Any permit for an existing building which would:
 - a. Create one or more additional dwelling units;
 - b. Involve a change in the occupancy group of a building as described in the Florida Building Code, or other building code in force and effect at the time; or
 - ~~e. Allow the dwelling unit to be used as an assisted living facility.~~

SECTION 10: All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict are repealed to the extent of such conflict.

SECTION 11: If any section, sentence, clause, or phrase of this Ordinance is held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, then said holding shall in no way affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

SECTION 12: It is the intention of the City Commission that the provisions of this Ordinance shall become and be made a part of the City of Margate Code, and that the sections of this Ordinance may be renumbered or relettered and the word "ordinance" may be changed to "section", "article" or such other appropriate word or phrase in order to accomplish such intentions.

SECTION 13: This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon adoption at its second reading.
