4. In order to allow sufficient time to secure required development order, building permit, and local business tax receipt approval, a special exception use application and fee must be filed with the Economic Development Department at least nine (9) months before the start of the school year. This time requirement cannot be waived or reduced.

[Note to Municipal Code: The rest of this section shall remain as codified.]

SECTION 2: All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are and the same is hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

SECTION 3: If any section, sentence, clause, or phrase of this ordinance is held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, then said holding shall in no way affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance.

<u>SECTION 4</u>: It is the intention of the City Commission that the provisions of this ordinance shall become and be made a part of the City of Margate Code, and that the sections of this ordinance may be renumbered or relettered and the word "ordinance" may be changed to "section", "article" or such other appropriate word or phrase in order to accomplish such intentions.

SECTION 5: This ordinance shall become effective immediately upon adoption at its second reading.
