An estimated combined total of 172,910 people in the US are expected to be diagnosed with a blood cancer in 2017; and

WHEREAS, leukemia, lymphoma, myeloma are expected to cause the deaths of an estimated 58,300 people in the United States in 2017; and

WHEREAS, The Leukemia & Lymphoma Society (LLS), exists to find cures and ensure access to treatments for blood cancer patients; and

WHEREAS, LLS maintains an office in Hollywood to help improve the quality of life for blood cancer patients and their families in the State of Florida; and

WHEREAS, Margate is similarly committed to the eradication of these diseases and supports the treatment of blood cancer patients and their families; and

WHEREAS, Margate encourages private efforts to enhance research funding and education programs that are saving lives not someday, but today.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Tommy Ruzzano, Mayor of the City of Margate, joins with LLS in designating the month of September 2017, as
