CITY OF MARGATE, FLORIDA ORDINANCE NO. 2017-23 AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MARGATE, FLORIDA, PROVIDING FOR A FOUR MONTH EXTENSION OF THE EXISTING SIX MONTH MORATORIUM APPROVED BY ORDINANCE 2017-7 ON MAY 17, 2017, FOR THE APPROVAL OF ANY MEDICAL MARIJUANA DISPENSARY AND/OR SIMILAR TYPES OF BUSINESSES WITHIN THE CITY MARGATE; PROVIDING OF FOR CONFLICT; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE. WHEREAS, on November 2, 2016, the City Commission passed Ordinance 2016-11, enacting a six month moratorium for the approval of any medical marijuana dispensary and/or similar type of business in anticipation of Amendment 2 on the November 8, 2016 election ballot; and WHEREAS, on November 8, 2016, voters in the State of Florida approved a proposed constitutional amendment regarding legalization of the use of medical marijuana in the State of Florida; and

WHEREAS, on June 23, 2017, Florida Senate Bill 8A was approved by Governor Rick Scott. This bill preempts local government regulation of medical marijuana cultivation, processing, and delivery; and

WHEREAS, the state preemption allows municipalities to ban medical marijuana treatment center dispensing facilities within municipal from being located boundaries. Alternatively, if a municipality chooses to allow medical marijuana treatment center dispensing facilities, then said municipality may not place specific limits on the number of may dispensing facilities that locate within that municipality, and said municipality may not enact ordinances for permitting or for determining the location of dispensing facilities which are more restrictive that its ordinances permitting determining the locations for or pharmacies licensed under Chapter 465, Florida Statutes; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission finds that this Ordinance is necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare of the City's residents.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF MARGATE, FLORIDA:

SECTION 1: That the foregoing "WHEREAS" clauses are ratified and confirmed as being true and correct and are incorporated herein.

SECTION 2: That the City Commission deems it to be in the best interest of the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of the City of Margate that a four month extension of the existing six month moratorium, approved by the City Commission pursuant to City Ordinance 2017-7 on May 17, 2017, be imposed on all real property within the City of Margate to approval of any medical pertaining the marijuana dispensary, or similar type business as described above, including Local Business Tax Receipts, Certificates of Occupancy, or any other development approval.

SECTION 3: All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict are repealed to the extent of such conflict.

SECTION 4: If any section, sentence, clause, or phrase of this Ordinance is held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, then said holding shall in no way affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance.
