Problem Identification

On February 14, 2018, the City of Parkland experienced a mass-shooting incident at Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School (MSDHS). Seventeen people were killed and another seventeen were injured when a former student opened fire on the school's campus.

Local and state law enforcement personnel, both sworn and non-sworn, worked numerous hours of overtime for incident response and post-incident activities between February 14, 2018 and February 28, 2018. The magnitude and urgency of the event resulted in a coordinated response of local, state and federal law enforcement and first responder personnel from more than 18 agencies.

The deployment of law enforcement resources to manage this event diverted significant available resources and strained public safety services, as well as budget capacities. Local and state agencies do not have excess funds available to absorb the increased costs resulting from this demand on their resources and manpower.

Project Summary (Scope of Work)

The Margate Police Department will utilize grant funds to pay approximately 68 hours of overtime and straight time over and above regularly scheduled hours for sworn and nonsworn administrative, intelligence, operational and law enforcement personnel that were activated in response to the MSDHS Incident.

Eligible activities for reimbursement shall encompass time spent on targeted enforcement or special details, including but not limited to: investigation, intelligence, securing the primary crime scene and secondary scenes, peripheral coordination and command centers, collection of evidence, student escort and family re-unification, increased post-incident law enforcement security at the Marjorie Stoneman Douglas High School facility, enhanced custodial security for the alleged gunman, or protective services for elected officials and dignitaries, family, media, or public individuals whose presence and appearances were a direct result of this incident.

Overtime pay will be commensurate with the Margate Police Department's compensation and pay policy, and include salary and related benefits. Documentation to be provided will include timesheets, officer activity sheets, payroll information, and pay stubs.

Overtime hours for non-law enforcement personnel, such as Fire or EMS, are not eligible for reimbursement under this grant.

The deliverable(s) for this agreement are the activities conducted by law enforcement personnel during the overtime hours worked and may include administrative,

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intelligence, operational and law enforcement services performed in response to the MSDHS incident.

Minimum Performance for law enforcement personnel is in accordance with state standards and as directed by the Recipient?s law enforcement agency employment agreement, position descriptions and/or incident command.

Financial consequences may be imposed for non-compliance including but not limited to project costs being disallowed and/or withholding of funds.
