Please describe the intended use of requested funds and indicate the time period you are requesting these funds for (please attach letters of community support if applicable):

We are requesting \$1,000 to help cover the cost of providing all 5th graders from Atlantic West Elementary, Liberty and Margate Elementary Schools with the JA BizTown experience this year. We project that four hundred and fifty-one (451) students will be completing the 16-hour in-class JA BizTown curriculum plus the one-day simulation at JA World. The curriculum leads them through the study of business principles, career exploration, banking procedures, business decisions and economic terms; it also includes a job interview process. They will then complete a one-day simulation at JA BizTown within JA World on October 3, December 13 and December 7, 2018, respectively, from approximately 8:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. During their day at JA BizTown, the new "employees" will go to work at one of the eighteen businesses, receive paychecks, spend money, and hopefully pay back their business loan by the end of the day. While not every student can be the company CEO, every student becomes a member of each company's team with a shared goal to be successful (to pay back a business loan at the end of the day).



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Please provide a needs statement (Why do you need the requested funds?):

JA BizTown meets the needs of a diverse group of students by providing engaging, academically enriching, experiential lessons. It gives kids a chance to own, manage and grow their own business. JA BizTown students will:

- Understand a huge variety of occupations are available to them.
- Demonstrate a basic understanding of the free enterprise system.
- Build money management skills through a practical knowledge of economic concepts and banking practices.
- Develop an understanding of basic business practices and responsibilities.
- Demonstrate the soft skills necessary for successful participation in the work-world.

JA BizTown costs approximately \$85 per student to implement. This includes the cost of delivering classroom curriculum and providing a real life simulation experience at JA World. Broward County Public Schools provides transportation to and from JA World, and as of last year has helped financially as well.

Explain the public benefit (educational, economic, health, etc.) to the City of Margate and its citizens from the City funds received:

JA BizTown offers a solid foundation to youth from which to grow. It provides them with opportunities to understand their responsibilities toward becoming the productive, effective, and ethical employees and employers the future is already demanding. It often is the first step to understanding the business world and their part in it, while increasing the potential completion of their education. While not every student can be the company CEO, every student becomes a member of each company's team with a shared goal to be successful (to pay back a business loan at the end of the day).

Per Superintendent Robert Runcie, the education and hands-on, practical experience our students receive through JA helps us create a pipeline of successful students prepared to contribute to our local economy in the future.

Please provide an outcome statement (What will be accomplished with the money?) explaining the impact as a result of obtaining funding from the City:

Funding from the City of Margate will help provide the fifth grade students of Atlantic West, Liberty and Margate Elementary Schools with knowledge of, and experience with, proper business greetings, answering a business phone, profit, accounts payable and receivable, writing checks, depositing funds, and balancing checkbooks, through the JA BizTown program.

Demonstrate how you will evaluate your results. These measures need to be directly related to the need and expected outcome:

- 90% of students complete the JA BizTown curriculum and one-day simulation, gaining experience with finding a job, business operations, and money management.
- 90% of students create a resume, apply for a job, are hired for a job and fulfill the assigned job duties.
- 90% of students open and manage a JA BizTown checking account.
- 85% of students show educational attainment between the pre- and the post-tests. These are administered on the first day of in-class curriculum and during the post-simulation follow-up in-class curriculum.
- Business CEO's create reports that detail production and sales figures, and provide instant feedback as to whether a business is meeting goals.
- Sales people receive practical training and experience with sales and customer service.
