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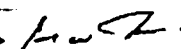

General Instructions

Future developments. Information about developments affecting Form W-9 (such as legislation enacted after we released it) is at www.irs.gov/irb.

Purpose of Form

An individual or entity (Form W-9 requester) who is required to file an information return with the IRS must obtain your correct taxpayer identification number (TIN) which may be your social security number (SSN), individual taxpayer identification number (ITIN), adoption taxpayer identification number (ATIN), or employer identification number (EIN), to report on an information return the amount paid to you, or other amount reportable on an information return. Examples of information returns include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Form 1042-INT (income earned or paid)
- Form 1042-DIV (dividends, including those from stocks or mutual funds)
- Form 1099-B (various types of income, prizes, awards, or gross proceeds)
- Form 1099-D (stock or mutual fund sales and certain other transactions by brokers)
- Form 1099-S (proceeds from real estate transactions)
- Form 1099-MISC (miscellaneous income and other reportable transactions)

- Form 1030 (home mortgage interest), 1030-E (student loan interest), 1030-T (tuition)
- Form 1099-C (canceled debt)
- Form 1032-A (acquisition or abandonment of secured property)

Use Form W-9 only if you are a U.S. person (including a resident alien), to provide your correct TIN.

If you do not return Form W-9 to the requester with a TIN, you may be subject to backup withholding. See What is backup withholding? on page 2.

By signing the filled-out form, you:

1. Certify that the TIN you are giving is correct (or you are waiting for a number to be issued).
2. Certify that you are not subject to backup withholding, or
3. Obtain exemption from backup withholding if you are a U.S. exempt payee. If applicable, you are also certifying that as a U.S. person, your allocable share of any partnership income from a U.S. trade or business is not subject to the withholding tax on foreign partners' share of effectively connected income, and
4. Certify that FATCA code(s) entered on this form (if any) indicating that you are exempt from the FATCA reporting, is correct. See What is FATCA reporting? on page 2 for further information.

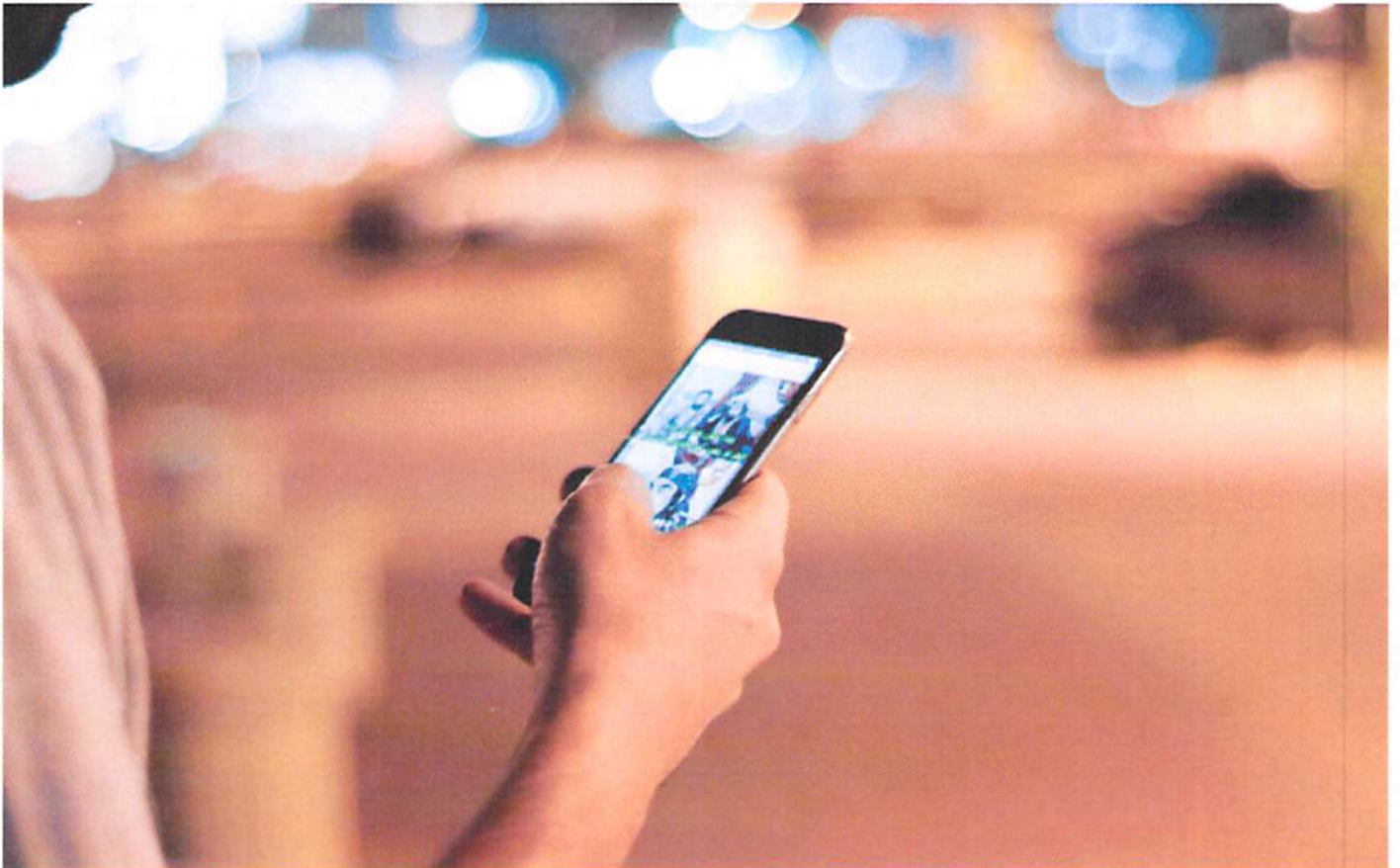

OUR PURPOSE

Crime Stoppers serves as a clearinghouse for tips, and acts as a liaison between anonymous citizens and law enforcement agencies. When a Citizen (or Tipster) calls in with a tip or information about a crime, Crime Stoppers disseminates that information to the appropriate law enforcement agency for immediate action. If your tip leads to an arrest, you will receive your reward anonymously.



OUR HISTORY

Crime Stoppers began in Albuquerque, New Mexico in 1976 to give the community a safe & anonymous way to report criminal activity. Today, it has grown worldwide with representation in more than 20 countries. Broward County Crime Stoppers, often recognized as one of the most successful programs in the world, was established in 1981 by Sheriff Robert Butterworth and Mr. David Rush.



OUR FUNDING

Crime Stoppers is a self-funding entity and does not rely on taxpayer contributions. All reward monies are raised throughout the year by our Board of Directors through special events, corporate sponsorships and private donations. Additional program funds come directly from the criminals themselves. The Broward County Circuit Court assesses a fine for every crime committed, which then goes towards our funding.

When you submit your tip online or through the P3 Tip App, you will receive a case number. You can use that case number to review the status of your tip. If your tip leads to an arrest, you are eligible for a cash reward. Rewards are collected anonymously at a local bank, so your identity is never compromised.
