Bicycle Lane Improvements in the City of Margate on NW 54 Avenue, NW 31st Street, and NW 62nd Avenue

Background

February 2012. Broward Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) publishes the Northern Broward County Livability Study Action Plan. "The Loop" – NW 54 Avenue, NW 31 Street, NW 62 Avenue, Turtle Creek Drive, and Cullum Road is identified as one of the locations for desired for Bicycle Facilities in the proposed 5 year plan.

January 2018. City of Coconut Creek chooses not to participate in MPO sponsored project electing instead to implement improvements on Cullum Road and NW 54 Avenue through separate City of Coconut Creek sponsored improvement projects.

February 2018. Workshop at the City of Margate.

March 2018. City of Coral Springs passes a Resolution of Support for the proposed project.

April 2018. City of Margate passes a Resolution of Support for the proposed project.

October 2018. City of Coral Springs selects a Typical Section for the project consisting of: Type D curbing, 1 - 10 foot lane, 1 - 11 foot lane and 1 - 4.5 foot bike lane in each direction.




Recommendations for Bicycle Facilities

Proposed bicycle facility improvements must meet specific criteria to be eligible for amendments to the 2035 LRTP on the semi-annual amendment cycle. Proposed projects must contribute to fulfilling the Vision of the 2035 LRTP, and they must have identifiable funding sources to meet the basic condition of the Cost Feasible Plan. The Broward MPO will take the lead in developing cost estimates and identifying specific funding sources for new or additional projects. The LRTP provides the basis for cost estimates (\$44/linear foot for bicycle facilities; the mix of on-road and off-road facilities will be determined during design).

City of Coral Springs Selected Improvement Option

In this discussion we will present improvement options for the City of Margate with the goal of selecting a preferred option to proceed to design.

Section A (East of SR 7 to Sample Road)

ROW width is somewhat limited (80') which limits the improvement options. Two (2) options are presented for review:

1. Shared Lane Markings,

2. On street bicycle lanes with median curb modifications.

Section B (West of SR 7 to Coral Springs)

ROW width is 100' allowing greater design flexibility.

1. On street bicycle lane with median curb modifications,


2. Buffered Bicycle Lanes with median modifications,

3. Multi-Use Paths with median modifications and outside shoulder modifications.











NW 62 Ave / NW 31 St – On Street Bicycle Lane




NW 62 Ave / NW 31 St – Buffered Bike Lane
