

SPECIAL EVENTS FUNDING/DONATION REQUEST PROGRAM INFORMATION GUIDE

Organizations or individuals seeking funding from the City of Margate must complete the Special Events Funding/Donation Request Application for Organizations or the Special Events Funding/Donation Request Application for Individuals. The amount requested cannot exceed \$1,000 per organization or \$500 per individual. Organizations or individuals must submit said application and necessary documentation to the City of Margate, City Clerk's Office, 5790 Margate Blvd., Margate, FL 33063.

For requests by both organizations and individuals, the funding request must provide a public benefit (educational, economic, health, etc.) to the City of Margate and its citizens. If the requestor is an individual, the individual must be a City of Margate resident. For individual requests, registration fees associated with a school, program, or event shall be paid directly to the sponsoring entity, if possible. If the requestor is an organization, the organization must:

- Be a non-profit organization, either with Articles of Incorporation filed with the Florida Department of State, or for those non-profits organized within another state, be registered with the State of Florida as a foreign corporation.
- Must have an active registration with the Florida Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services (FDAC) unless exempt pursuant to Florida Statutes.
- Be in existence and operating within the State of Florida for at least twelve (12) months prior to the date of application to the City for a donation.
- Submit in addition to their application: (1) a copy of their 501(c)3, 501(c)4, or 501(c)6 notification letter; (2) a copy of their current Form 990 (if your organization is required to file this document);
 (3) a copy of their last completed audit; and (4) annual budget.

After receipt of the application, all applications shall be presented to the City Commission at the next regularly-scheduled City Commission meeting. Applicants are strongly encouraged to attend the City Commission meeting in which their request is to be heard, in order to provide additional information about their request as needed. Failure to attend the meeting may cause the request to be denied or tabled by the City Commission. The City Commission, at its sole discretion, shall determine which organizations or individuals are awarded funding. All decisions of the City Commission are final and binding. Once funding has been approved, the approved amount will be provided to the organization or individual. Please note that an affidavit will be prepared by the City and must be completed by the organization or individual recipient within two weeks of the event/expenditure. In addition, reports of service delivery/expenditures of any funds and/or receipts may be required. Furthermore, all individual recipients are requested to provide/present photographs/details following the event/expenditure at a public meeting. If an organization or individual is awarded a donation for a particular purpose/event, and the event is canceled, a full reimbursement to the City is required. Organizations and individuals may apply for one donation per fiscal year. Organizations or individuals that have failed to meet a reimbursement obligation in previous years or additional conditions of approval will not be eligible for future consideration until all prior obligations have been fulfilled.

Please describe the intended use of requested funds and indicate the time period you are requesting these funds for (please attach letters of community support if applicable): ReadingPals is an early literacy initiative focused on screening, engaging, training, and deploying volunteer mentors in Broward County. ReadingPals volunteers meet weekly with at-risk children to improve participating children's literacy and language skills; providing the individual attention many children need to thrive. Participating children are paired with a trained ReadingPals volunteer for a 25-week period who engage in guided reading and mentoring for 1 hour each week between September and May. Funding from the City of Margate would provide ReadingPals for 30 first grade students at Margate Elementary. Funds would provide 17 books for the each student to use during their sessions, and student would take these books home to keep after completed. Funding would also provide two family literacy nights for Margate Elementary to facilitated activities to engage parents in literacy alongside students.

Please provide a needs statement (Why do you need the requested funds?):

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, many students in Broward County and across the nation experienced learning loss, which has been labeled the "COVID slide." When looking at the Florida Standards Assessment (FSA) data, in 2019 only 60% of third graders in Broward County were reading on grade level. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, we do not have data for 2020. However, in 2021 this number decreased to 53% of third graders reading on grade level in Broward County. However, there was not enough data gathered, due to student absences for the assessment; meaning this data is unable to be used to show where our County is as a whole in regards to third grade literacy. Due to all of the disruptions education has experienced in the past year, students are in need of additional literacy resources and support now more than ever.

Explain the public benefit (educational, economic, health, etc.) to the City of Margate and its citizens from the City funds received:

During the 2018/2019 program year, first graders who participated in ReadingPals, on average, ended the year reading one reading level above those students in a similar demographic who did not rreceive a ReadingPal. ReadingPals provides much needed one-on-one mentoring support for students who are identified as being behind in literacy skills. Statistically, students who are not reading at grade level by the end of third grade are four times more likely to drop out of high school. ReadingPals helps provide additional support to improve students literacy skills.

ReadingPals will benefit the City of Margate by helping increase students' literacy scores by providing them with essential one-on-one mentoring.

Please provide an outcome statement (What will be accomplished with the money?) explaining the impact as a result of obtaining funding from the City:

Participating students will be better prepared to reach academy literacy milestones through the ReadingPals intervention. Based on 2018-2019 data, students with a Reading Pal made more significant gains in their Benchmark Assessment System (BAS) scores than students in comparison groups. Additionally, results showed that families are more engaged in early childhood literacy activities after the ReadingPals intervention.

During the 2020-2021 school year, the ReadingPals program operated at 16 schools; including 4 childcare facilities. In total, ReadignPals served 121 students in Broward County.

During the 2020-2021 school year, ReadingPals distributed 8,200 books to children in Broward County.

Demonstrate how you will evaluate your results. These measures need to be directly related to the need and expected outcome:

First Grade Students:

- 70% of ReadingPals' students will show a positive change in their BAS scores from time one to time two.

Teachers:

- 85% of the ReadingPals participating teachers will report that the program is beneficial to his/her students and there has been a measurable increase in a student's literacy level.
