Junior Achievement of South Florida (JASF) continues its mission to inspire and prepare young people to succeed in a competitive, global economy. Young people face the challenge of succeeding in an increasingly complex global economy and they need help to succeed from local business leaders, educators, and mentors.

JASF serves over 50,000 students per year with the help of 7,000+ JA-trained volunteers, mentors and 2,000 teachers. JA offers 30 programs to provide relevant, hands-on experiences that improve students' knowledge and financial literacy, workforce readiness, and entrepreneurship skills.

Every public school 5th grade student in Margate participates in our JA BizTown program. **During the 2020/2021 school year we served over 400 students from 3 elementary schools in the City of Margate with our JA BizTown program.** JA BizTown included up to 16 hours of classroom learning and a one-day real life simulation. In response to COVID-19 JASF launched virtual simulations to engage students who are unable to attend the on-site simulation. To ensure continued delivery of our programs to students, all JA programs are available online including JA BizTown and JA Finance Park.

We hope the City of Margate will continue to partner with us by investing in this essential education. The students we are training today are the future drivers of our local economy – our consumers, our employees, and our business owners.

Please describe the intended use of requested funds and indicate the time period you are requesting these funds for (please attach letters of community support if applicable):

We are requesting \$1,000 to help cover the cost of providing all 5th graders from Atlantic West Elementary, Liberty and Margate Elementary Schools with the JA BizTown Adventures experience this year.

We project that four hundred and forty-two (442) students will be completing the 16-hour in-class JA BizTown curriculum. The curriculum leads them through the study of business principles, career exploration, banking procedures, business decisions and economic terms; it also includes a job interview process. Upon completion of the curriculum students will then complete a one-day simulation at JA BizTown within JA World. The capstone experience is from approximately 8:00 am to 2:00 pm. During their day at JA BizTown, the new "employees" will go to work at one of the eighteen businesses, receive paychecks, spend money, and hopefully pay back their business loan by the end of the day. While not every student can be the company CEO, every student becomes a member of each company's team with a shared goal to be successful (to pay back a business loan at the end of the day). Students unable to attend the on-site capstone experience will have the



Please provide a needs statement (Why do you need the requested funds?):

JA BizTown meets the needs of a diverse group of students by providing engaging, academically enriching, experiential lessons. It gives kids a chance to own, manage and grow their own business. JA BizTown students will:

- Understand a huge variety of occupations are available to them.
- Demonstrate a basic understanding of the free enterprise system.
- Build money management skills through a practical knowledge of economic concepts and banking practices.
- Develop an understanding of basic business practices and responsibilities.
- Demonstrate the soft skills necessary for successful participation in the work-world.

JA BizTown costs approximately \$85 per student to implement. This includes the cost of delivering classroom curriculum and students' participation in the one-day capstone simulation at JA World or the virtual JA BizTown Adventures experience.

Explain the public benefit (educational, economic, health, etc.) to the City of Margate and its citizens from the City funds received:

JA BizTown is an educational program that offers a solid foundation to youth from which to grow. It provides them with opportunities to understand their responsibilities toward becoming the productive, effective, and ethical employees and employers the future is already demanding. It often is the first step to understanding the business world and their part in it, while increasing the potential completion of their education.

Please provide an outcome statement (What will be accomplished with the money?) explaining the impact as a result of obtaining funding from the City:

Funding from the City of Margate will help provide the fifth grade students of Atlantic West Elementary, Liberty Elementary, and Margate Elementary Schools with knowledge of, and experience with, proper business greetings, answering a business phone, profit, accounts payable and receivable, writing checks, depositing funds, and balancing checkbooks. Students will receive up to 16 hours of in-class curriculum followed by the one-day capstone simulation at JA BizTown in JA World. The virtual JA BizTown Adventures program will be available for students who are unable to attend the on-site capstone simulation.

Demonstrate how you will evaluate your results. These measures need to be directly related to the need and expected outcome:

- 90% of students complete the JA BizTown curriculum and JA BizTown Capstone program or JA BizTown Adventures (virtual simulation), gaining experience with finding a job, business operations, and money management.
- 90% of students create a resume, apply for a job, are hired for a job and fulfill the assigned job duties.
- 90% of students open and manage a JA BizTown checking account.
- 85% of students show educational attainment between the pre- and the post-tests. These are administered on the first day of in-class curriculum and during the post-simulation follow-up in-class curriculum.
