RESOLUTION: APPROVAL OF MCRA RESOLUTION FOR THE APPROVAL OF INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE MARGATE COMMUNITY REDEVELOPMENT AGENCY (MCRA) AND THE CITY OF MARGATE FOR LANDSCAPING AND IRRIGATION SERVICES OF COPANS ROAD FROM STATE ROAD 7 TO HAMMOCKS BLVD.

BACKGROUND:

The City of Margate and Broward County have executed on February 17, 2016 (Exhibit 1), an Agreement for Trafficway Beautification for Copans Road from State Road 7/US 441 to Hammocks Boulevard.

Section 163.01, Florida Statutes, known as the "Florida Interlocal Cooperation Act of 1969" authorizes local governments to make the most efficient use of their powers by enabling them to cooperate with other localities on a basis of mutual advantage and thereby to provide services and facilities that would harmonize geographic, economic, population and other factors influencing the needs and developments of local communities.

The medians along Copans Road from State Road 7/US 441 to Hammocks Boulevard are currently maintained by the City of Margate for an annual cost of \$2,400. This cost does not include irrigation services, which is conducted in-house by the Parks and Recreation Department. Through the approval of an Interlocal Agreement between the City and the MCRA the MCRA will be able to oversee and cover the maintenance of medians on the subject area effective October 1, 2018.

In an effort to provide accountability and transparency on all MCRA tasks and expenditures, Staff is recommending the approval of an Interlocal Agreement between the City of Margate and the Margate Community Redevelopment Agency (Exhibit 2) for the maintenance of irrigation and landscaping associated with the medians on Copans Road from State Road 7/US 441 to Hammocks Boulevard. The agreement serves both a municipal and public purpose, is consistent with and furthers the CRA's Redevelopment Plan, and is consistent with the requirements of Chapter 163, Florida Statutes.

Further, the MCRA, in collaboration with the City's Purchasing Division, is working on the release of a request for proposals (RFP) to engage a company that will provide landscape and irrigation services to the Agency. The existing agreement with current vendor is coming to an end at the conclusion of present Fiscal Year. The RFP will be issued within the upcoming weeks and vendor shall be awarded to begin working in the new Fiscal Year 2018-2019.

MCRA Staff will present the proposed Interlocal Agreement to the City Commission for consideration during the meeting of July 11, 2018.
